Significant Issues:

Statewide Fires

Yesterday the Alaska Interagency Coordination Center moved to Planning Level 4 of 5 for wildland fire given the number of fires in the state and forecasted weather. A high-pressure ridge has set up over much of Alaska, causing increasing fire risk. SEOC is in daily contact with State Forestry for contingency planning of Mass Care, evacuation, National Guard, and other resources. On the 1,930-acre Clear Fire (#346), burning near Anderson, a Type 2 Incident Management Team from the Lower 48 will in-brief tomorrow and take command of the fire on Saturday.

SEOC executed a resource order for a UH 60 Blackhawk Helicopter from the Alaska National Guard AKNG to assist with fire suppression.

SEOC held a Mass Care Group meeting with the Red Cross, Salvation Army, and multiple volunteer and faith-based organizations that support statewide evacuation and sheltering operations to provide situational awareness and verify readiness during the high fire risk.

SEOC was contacted late yesterday afternoon by the Municipality of Anchorage about the fire at Elmore/Dowling for possible use of Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) and Emergency Alert System (EAS) which the Anchorage Emergency Management Director decided was not needed last night based of fire behavior and spread. 17 Anchorage Fire Department units, 3 air tankers, the Division of Forestry, and JBER fire crews were on scene fighting the fire.

Skagway Rockslide

SEOC received report of a rockslide that damaged the railroad dock in Skagway. SEOC has been in contact with Skagway officials and do not have immediate need for assistance at this time. Dock will remain closed until engineers can assess damages. In the meantime, cruise ships are being reaccommodated for safety.

Lowell Point Landslide Disaster

A joint SEOC/FEMA team completed preliminary damage assessment for the Lowell Point landslide disaster in Seward.


