Significant Issues:

Statewide Fires

SEOC remains at Preparedness Level 2 - Heightened Awareness in response to the statewide fire situation. The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center continues at Planning Level 4 of 5 for wildland fire with 150 active fires. SEOC is monitoring 16 of those fires that pose some risk to communities and is participating in Incident Management Team Cooperator briefings for these fires. With very little precipitation forecast across the state, the concern for fire growth or new starts continues. AICC has ordered additional firefighting resources from the lower-48 to assist with current and potential Alaska fires.

Both the Clear Fire (#346) near the City of Anderson in the Denali Borough and the Minto Lakes Fire (#349) in the Fairbanks North Star Borough have some outlying areas under evacuation "GO" status. SEOC is in regular contact with Borough Emergency Management to coordinate any required support.

SEOC held a Mass Care group coordination call this week and will continues those calls twice weekly while statewide fire risk is severe

SEOC is in daily contact with State Forestry for contingency planning of Mass Care, evacuation, National Guard, and other resources.

2022 Spring Flood Disaster

A joint state/FEMA team is conducting their Preliminary Damage Assessment on the Kuskowim River area today in the communities of Red Devil and McGrath.


