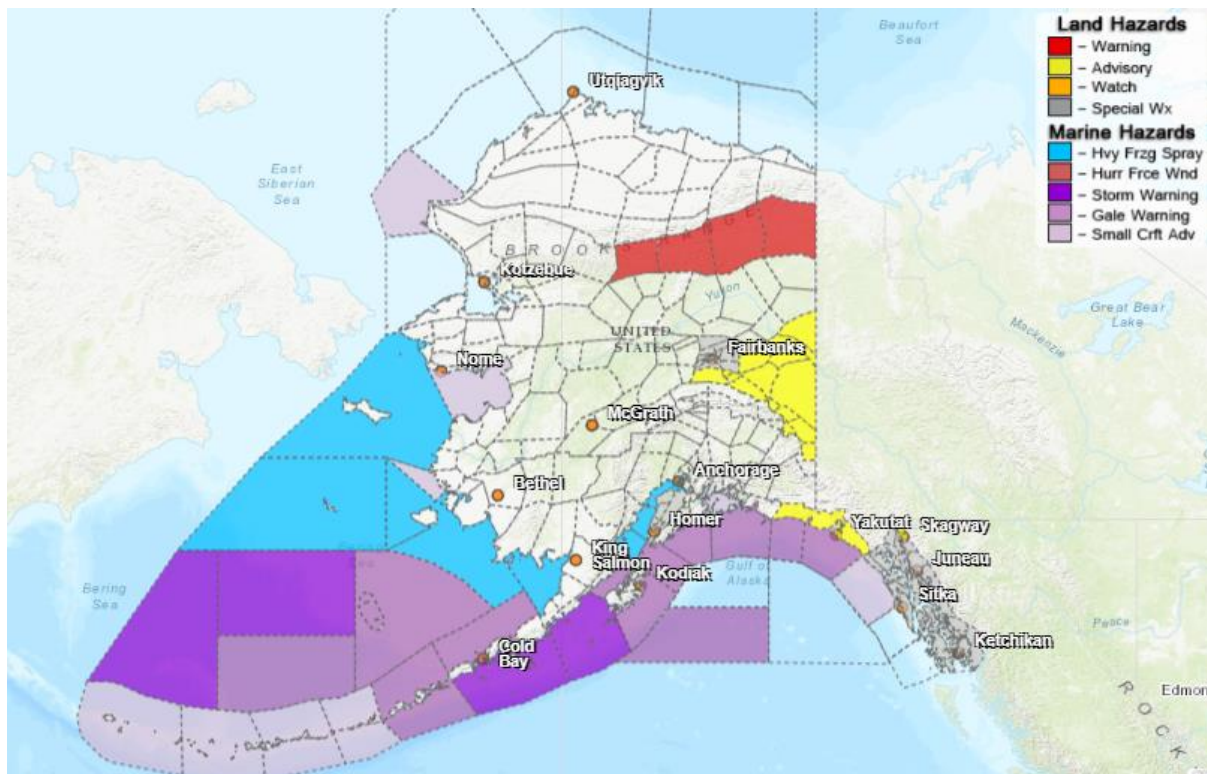

Significant Weather:



Wind chill warning in effect for the Southeastern Brooks Range until noon today for wind chills as low as 70 degrees below zero.

Winter weather advisory for the City and Borough of Yakutat from noon Tuesday until 7am Wednesday for 5 to 7 inches of snow.

Wind chill advisory in effect for the Municipality of Skagway until 10am Wednesday for wind chill temperatures as low as 45 degrees below zero.

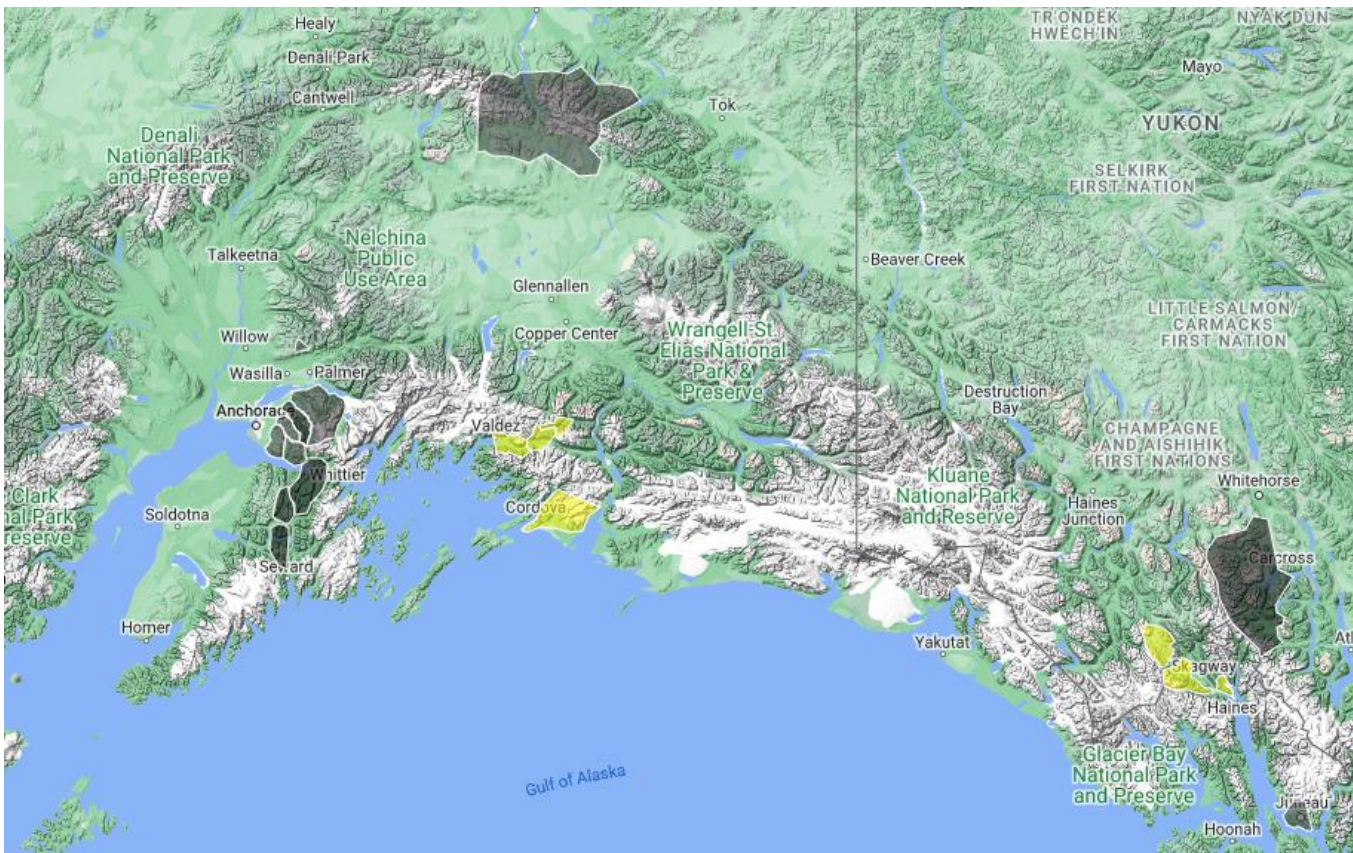
Wind chill advisory in effect for the Deltana Upper Tanana Valley and Tanana Flats through this afternoon for wind chill temperatures as low as 55 degrees below zero.

Special weather statements are in effect for the Southeast Panhandle for extreme cold temperatures through Wednesday. A shift from colder temperatures is expected to bring heavy snowfall starting in the Southern Panhandle late Thursday then move north Friday into Saturday. Current projections are for 6 to 12 inches of snow primarily Friday into Saturday.

Special weather statement in effect for the Western Kenai Peninsula for potential ice jam on the Kenai River from Kenai Keys to Soldotna into Wednesday.
