SEOC was notified through FEMA Region X that the request for a presidential declaration (IA and PA) for the Suicide Basin Glacial Flood event was denied. SEOC Disaster Assistance staff will continue to implement State disaster assistance programs to support the survivors as well as the City and Borough of Juneau.

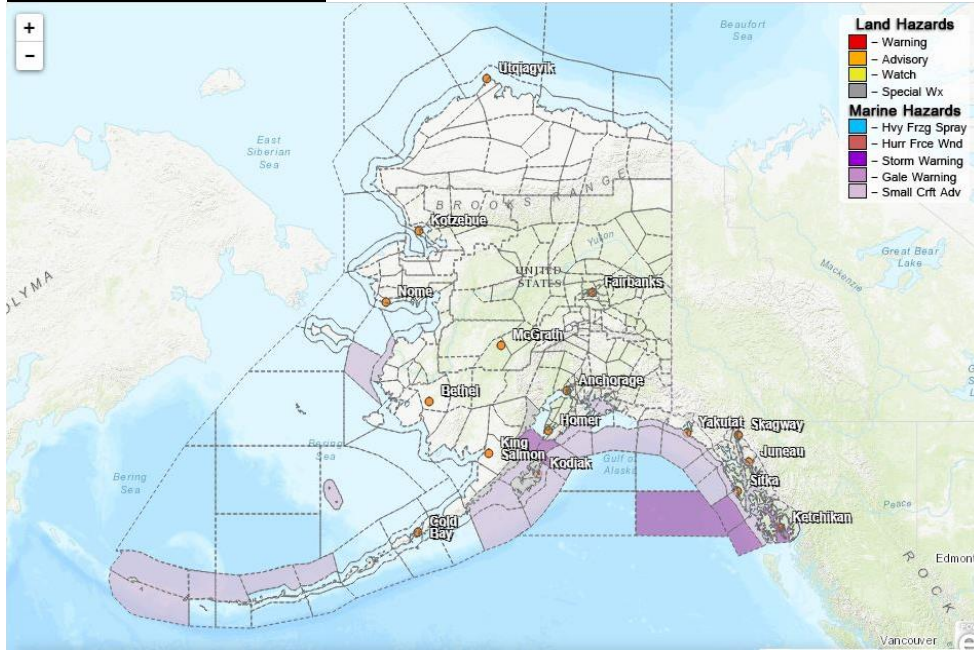

Special Weather Statement:

Resuspended ash from Katmai-Novarupta expected over Kodiak Island through Wednesday evening.

Strong northwesterly winds up to 40 mph have developed across Shelikof Strait. These winds are resuspending ash from the 1912 Katmai-Novarupta eruption. The villages of Karluk and Larsen Bay are most likely to be impacted. Ash is currently north of Akhiok, but ash may mix south to the area.

Those with respiratory ailments in these areas are encouraged to avoid or reduce outdoor activity to avoid inhaling the ash through late this evening. The winds will diminish late Wednesday, which should cause the ash to settle out of the atmosphere.
