Significant Issues:

Wrangell Landside Disaster:

Double lane emergency access routes remain open through the slide area with electrical power to southside residents. Wrangell Police continue to conduct a limited access schedule for residents on either side of the slide. Emergency response and recovery operations continue in coordination with debris removal and reactive search operations. State Individual Assistance Hotline and website is open for residents of Wrangell and Coffman Cove who have experienced damages to their home or have eligible personal expenses that are a direct result of the landslides.

Prince of Wales Island, including City of Klawock and City of Craig:

Governor Dunleavy amended his November 21, 2023, declaration today to include the entire Southeast Island School District Regional Education Attendance Area, including the City of Craig, Hydaburg, and all other impacted jurisdictions and areas on Prince of Wales Island, including City of Klawock for individual and public assistance. SEOC continues to assess damages and coordinate state-level support to affected communities.

Diomede – Potential Building Structural Collapse

SEOC received DOT/PF Engineer's report following the structural assessment conducted Sunday and SEOC continues to work with the City of Diomede, Bering Strait School District, Kawerak, DOT, ANTHC and DEC to evaluate any potential impacts from the building collapse. Diomede's school is closed today but will resume school through remote learning.



Winter Storm Warning: Municipality of Skagway; Haines Borough and Klukwan

- Heavy snow expected until 12:00 PM December 5th. Total snow accumulations of 5 to 12 inches.
- Travel will be very difficult and is discouraged unless it is an emergency.

Special Weather Statement: Kivalina and Red Dog Dock; Baldwin Peninsula; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Interior Seward Peninsula; Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills; Yukon Delta Coast

- Unsettled Weather for the West Coast through Saturday with wind gusts up to 45 mph.
- Heavy snow squalls and periodic near blizzard conditions to the Bering Strait and into the weekend. Snow amounts will range from 2 to 5 inches.
- Winds will shift to the north-northwest Wednesday night which will reduce visibility to 1/2 mile or less at times resulting in difficult travel conditions.

Winter Weather Advisory: Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp, Diomede, Shishmaref; Bering Strait Coast including St Lawrence Island.

- Total snow accumulations of 3 to 6 inches with north winds gusting as high as 55 mph.
- Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp winds gusting up to 40 mph at times Wednesday will result in blowing snow, reduce visibility to 1/2 mile, and wind chills down to -25 below zero.
- Plan on slippery road conditions. Areas of blowing snow could significantly reduce visibility and use caution while traveling.
