Crooked Creek Power Issues

Crooked Creek continues to experience intermittent power outages. A Middle Kuskokwim Electric Cooperative mechanic is expected to arrive in the community this week to assist with generator repairs. BIA was able to coordinate sending out pallets of bottled water to Crooked Creek yesterday since the electrical outages prohibit their water station from functioning.



Significant Weather:



The following Blizzard Warnings are in effect:

• Yukon Delta – Blizzard conditions expected with snow accumulation of 2 to 5 inches and winds gusting as high as 45 mph from 1:00PM this afternoon through 3:00AM Friday.

• St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast – Blizzard conditions expected with snow accumulation up to 2 inches and winds gusting as high as 55mph from 3:00PM this afternoon through 3:00AM Friday.

The following Winter Weather Advisories are in effect:

- Western Arctic Coast Snow and blowing snow with low visibility and very low wind chills through today at noon.
- Upper Koyukuk Valley Snow and blowing snow with accumulation of 1 3 inches and winds gusting as high as 30 mph through 4:00PM this afternoon.
- Yukon Flats and Surrounding Uplands Snow and blowing snow expected with reduced visibility and snow accumulation up to 1 inch from 9:00AM this morning through 6:00AM Friday.
- Bristol Bay Freezing rain expected with total ice accumulation around 1/10 of an inch.
- Southeastern Brooks Range Snow and blowing snow with wind chills to 45 below and additional snow accumulations of 2-3 inches through 4:00PM today.
- Southern Seward Peninsula Coast Snow and blowing snow expected with accumulation of 1


 3 inches and winds gusting as high as 50 mph from 6:00PM this evening through 6:00AM
 Friday.
- Eastern Alaska Range Snow mixed with freezing rain from Black Rapids south with additional snow accumulation of up to 3 inches and wind gusts as high as 50 mph through today at noon.
- Pribilof Islands Blowing snow with wind gusts up to 50 mph with extreme limited visibility from 3:00AM to 9:00AM Thursday.
- Chukchi Sea Coast from Kivalina North Blowing snow with low visibility expected. Winds
 gusting as high as 50 mph and 2 inches of snow accumulation through noon today.

The following Winter Storm Warnings are in effect:

• Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys – Heavy snow expected with accumulation of 8 to 12 inches and winds gusting as high as 40 mph with 35 below wind chill through noon today.
