Significant Issues:

Northwest Arctic Borough (NWAB) advised SEOC that the City of Kotzebue has declared a local disaster due to a winter storm(s) resulting in overwhelming snow. City is requesting \$150,000 in disaster funds to remove snow. NWAB is actively engaging with the city and reaching out to other communities in the Borough to see if there are additional impacts. The SEOC is evaluating the declaration to identify potential resource that may be able to assist.



Significant Weather:




The following Winter Weather Advisories are in effect:

- Northeastern Brooks Range Snow and blowing snow with periods of low visibility expected. Total snow accumulations of 4 to 7 inches. Winds gusting as high as 45 mph through 6:00PM Thursday.
- Central Beaufort Sea Coast Snow and blowing snow with low visibility expected. Total snow accumulations of up to 4 inches. Winds gusting as high as 40 mph through 3:00PM Thursday.
- Upper Tanana Valley and the Fortymile Country Snow and blowing snow with periods of low visibility expected. Total snow accumulations of 2 to 4 inches. Winds gusting as high as 35 mph from 12:00AM tonight through 6:00AM Friday.
- Southeastern Brooks Range Snow and blowing snow occurring. Total snow accumulations 3 to 6 inches. Visibility one half mile or less at times. Winds gusting to 40 mph through 6:00AM Friday.
- Deltana and Tanana Flats Snow and blowing snow with periods of low visibility expected. Brief freezing rain. Ice accumulation of a light glaze. Total snow accumulations of 4 to 6 inches through midnight tonight.
- Eastern Alaska Range Snow and blowing snow with periods of low visibility expected. Total snow accumulations of 6 to 8 inches. Winds gusting as high as 40 mph through midnight tonight.
- Denali Mixed freezing rain, sleet and snow. Blowing snow with low visibility. Ice accumulations of a light glaze, and snow accumulations of 6 inches are expected through 6:00PM this evening.
- Middle Tanana Valley Snow occurring. Storm total snow accumulations of 3 to 4 inches are expected through 6:00PM tonight.
- Yukon Flats and Surrounding Uplands Snow and blowing snow with low visibility. Snow accumulations
 of 4 to 6 inches are expected. Visibility one half mile or less at times. Northwest winds gusting to 30
 mph through 6:00PM Thursday.

High wind warning in effect for Northeast Prince William Sound: Valdez through Thompson Pass from 1:00AM Friday through 9:00PM Friday for northeast winds 45 to 55 mph with gusts as high as 80 mph.

Avalanche Forecast:



- Haines Considerable avalanche conditions above 1,500ft and moderate below 1,500 ft.
- Valdez Moderate avalanche danger at all elevations.
- Cordova area: Moderate advisory level above 2,000ft and low advisory level below 2,000ft.
- Turnagain Pass Moderate advisory level above 1,000ft, low advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Hatcher Pass Moderate advisory level at all elevations and on slopes 35° and steeper.
