

## Significant Weather:




Winter weather advisories are in effect for the following areas:

- Kodiak Island until 8pm this evening for 3 to 5 inches of snow with isolated areas inland up to 10 inches and winds gusting to 40mph.
- Copper River Basin until noon today for snow accumulation of 1 to 3 inches.
- Northeast Prince William Sound, Thompson Pass until noon today for 4 to 8 inches of snow and winds gusting to 35mph.

A special weather statement has been issued for a strong storm moving into the Central Bering Sea starting Sunday night through Tuesday. The storm is expected to bring gale force winds, snow and possible blizzard conditions to the Bering Strait Coast, St. Lawrence Island, and the Yukon Delta.

- Haines High avalanche conditions at all levels.
- Valdez Considerable avalanche danger at all elevations.
- Cordova area: Considerable advisory level above1,000 ft and Moderate advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass High advisory level at all elevations.
- Hatcher Pass Low advisory level at all elevations and on slopes 35° and steeper.
