### **Significant Issues:**

#### **Teller Water and Fuel Shortage**

The SEOC received a letter from the Native Village of Teller yesterday regarding the water shortage that began on April 17th. They are seeking donations of bottled water, personal cleansing cloths, paper products and disposable utensils. The SEOC has scheduled a multi-agency coordination call for this afternoon with local, tribal, state, federal, and volunteer agencies to discuss these requests.

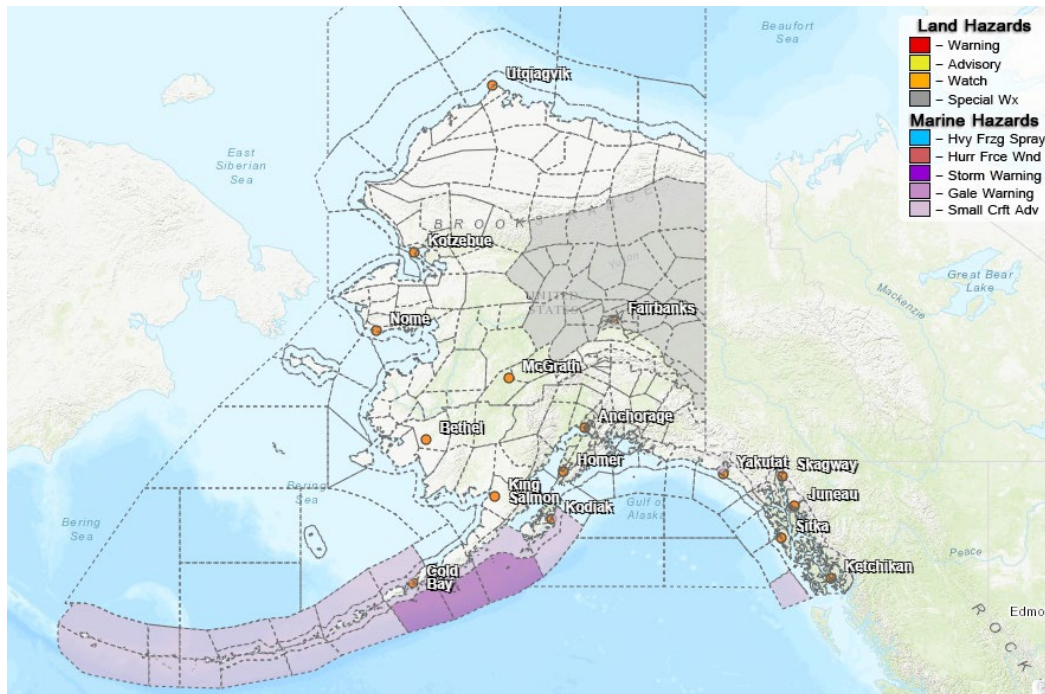

## Significant Weather:



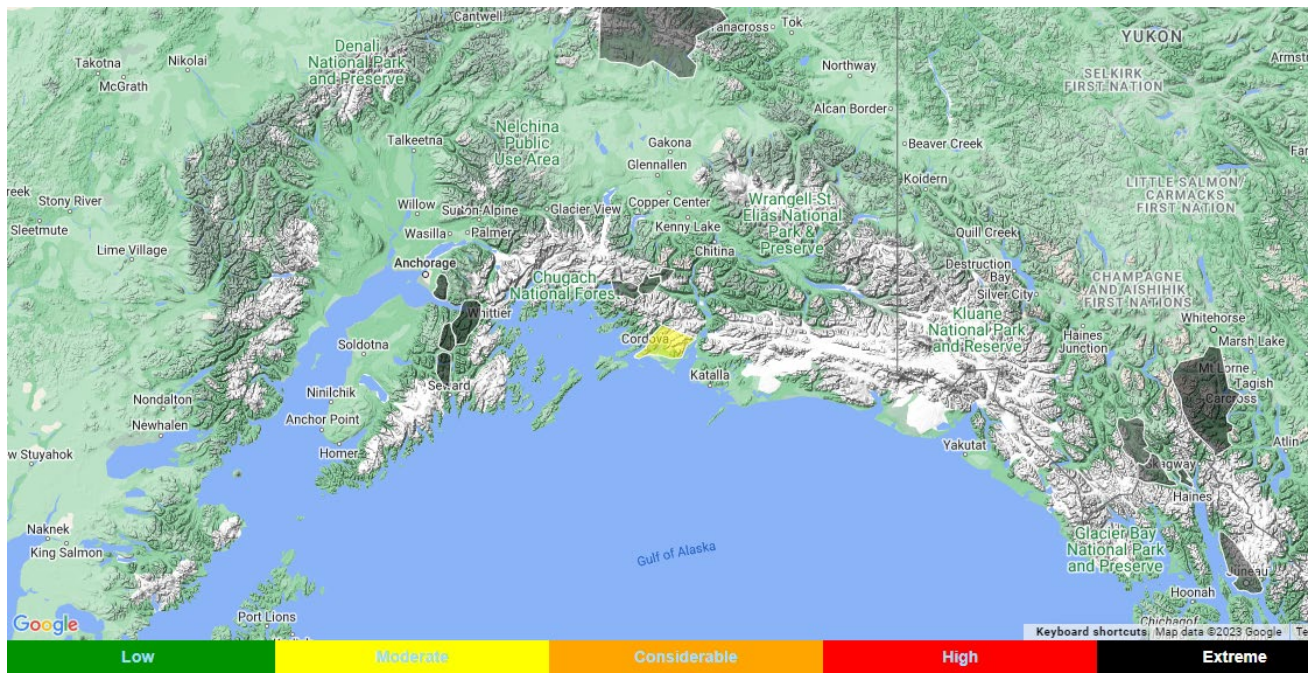
The following special weather statement has been issued:

Southeastern Brooks Range; Upper Koyukuk Valley; Yukon Flats and Surrounding Uplands; Central Interior; Middle Tanana Valley; Upper Tanana Valley and the Fortymile Country - Warm Temperatures Through Friday

Afternoon Followed by Sharp Cooling over the Weekend. Strong high pressure building over the Interior will keep the Interior under mostly sunny skies and much warmer temperatures. Highs will be in the upper 30s to upper 40s on Thursday, and near 40 on Friday. Lows will be in the teens and 20s.

### **Avalanche Forecast:**



- Valdez - Considerable avalanche advisory at all levels.
- Haines - Considerable advisory level above 1,500ft and moderate advisory level below 1,500ft.
- Cordova area - Moderate advisory level above 2,000 ft, low advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass: Avalanche danger is considerable at all levels.
- Hatcher Pass – Avalanche danger is moderate at all levels.
