





The following Winter Weather Advisories have been issued:


St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast – Snow and blowing snow with total accumulation of 2 inches and winds gusting up to 35 MPH expected though 4:00PM this afternoon.

The Following Frost Advisories have been issued:

City and Borough of Yakutat; Municipality of Skagway; Haines Borough and Klukwan; Glacier Bay; Eastern Chichagof Island; Admiralty Island; City and Borough of Juneau - Temperatures as low as 30 will result in frost formation from midnight tonight through 7:00AM tomorrow.

Avalanche Forecast:



- Valdez Considerable avalanche danger at all levels.
- Haines Avalanche danger is high, and conditions are dangerous at all levels.
- Cordova area Moderate advisory level above 1,000 ft, low advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass: Moderate advisory level below 2,500ft and considerable advisory level above 2,500ft.
- Hatcher Pass Forecast season has finished but the avalanche threat remains.
