State Public & Individual Assistance, Small Business Administration, and Federal Emergency Management Agency teams have returned from the upper Yukon communities. They will continue the Joint Preliminary Damage Assessments next week in Crooked Creek, Pilot Station, Kwethluk, Russian Mission, and Emmonak.

Air Quality Index (AQI) Advisories

Air Quality Advisory in effect for Southeast Alaska until Saturday at 9:00 AM. The intensity of the British Columbia fires has increased, and the wind pattern has shifted. Upper-level smoke plumes will migrate into the southern region of Southeast Alaska. Majority of the impact will be haze during the day, smoke will settle in the mountains, late evening/early morning hours and drain into the coastal communities. Conditions support continued fire and smoke production for the advisory period. Air Quality will vary between **GOOD** and **UNHEALTHY** depending on wind flow and proximity to the fires.

Air Quality Category	Cautionary Statements
Good	None
Moderate	Unusually sensitive people should consider reducing prolonged or heavy exertion.
Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups	People with heart or lung disease, the elderly and children should reduce prolonged or heavy exertion.
Unhealthy	People with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should avoid prolonged exertion; everyone else should limit prolonged exertion
Very Unhealthy	People with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should avoid any outdoor activity; everyone else should avoid prolonged exertion
Hazardous	Everyone should avoid any outdoor exertion; people with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should remain indoors

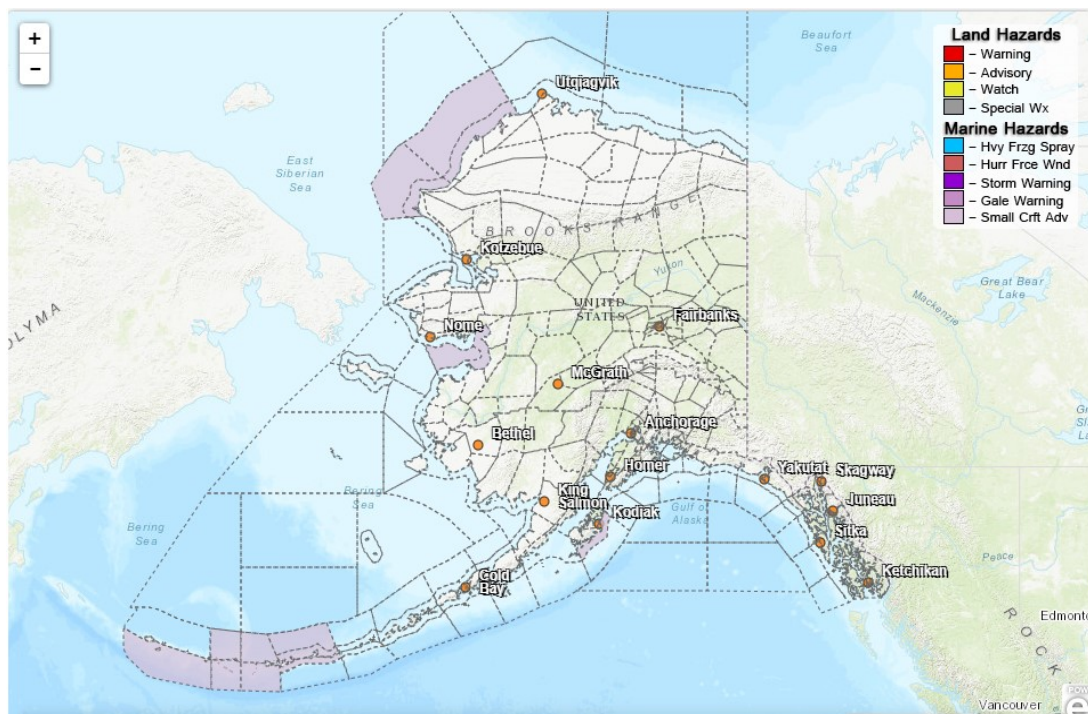
