Significant Issues:

Numerous wildland fires in the Interior continued to spread yesterday resulting in a change of over 8,000 additional acres to the statewide year-to-date estimated total.

State Operations is now an active participant in the Anderson Complex Cooperators Team Meetings which were initiated by the Type 2 Incident Management Team (IMT) yesterday. The SEOC anticipates sending emergency managers up to the Anderson Complex with the Mobile Emergency Operations Center (MEOC) trailer tomorrow. The MEOC will be staffed for the remainder of the threat, to provide a reliable base of operations and communications platform. In addition, the SEOC continues daily contact with both the Denali and North Star Borough local emergency management personnel, ensuring lines of open communication.

The city and Borough of Juneau are under a flood watch for possible flooding associated with the glacier-dammed Mendenhall Lake and river within Suicide Basin. The SEOC is actively coordinating with Juneau area emergency management and monitoring the situation.

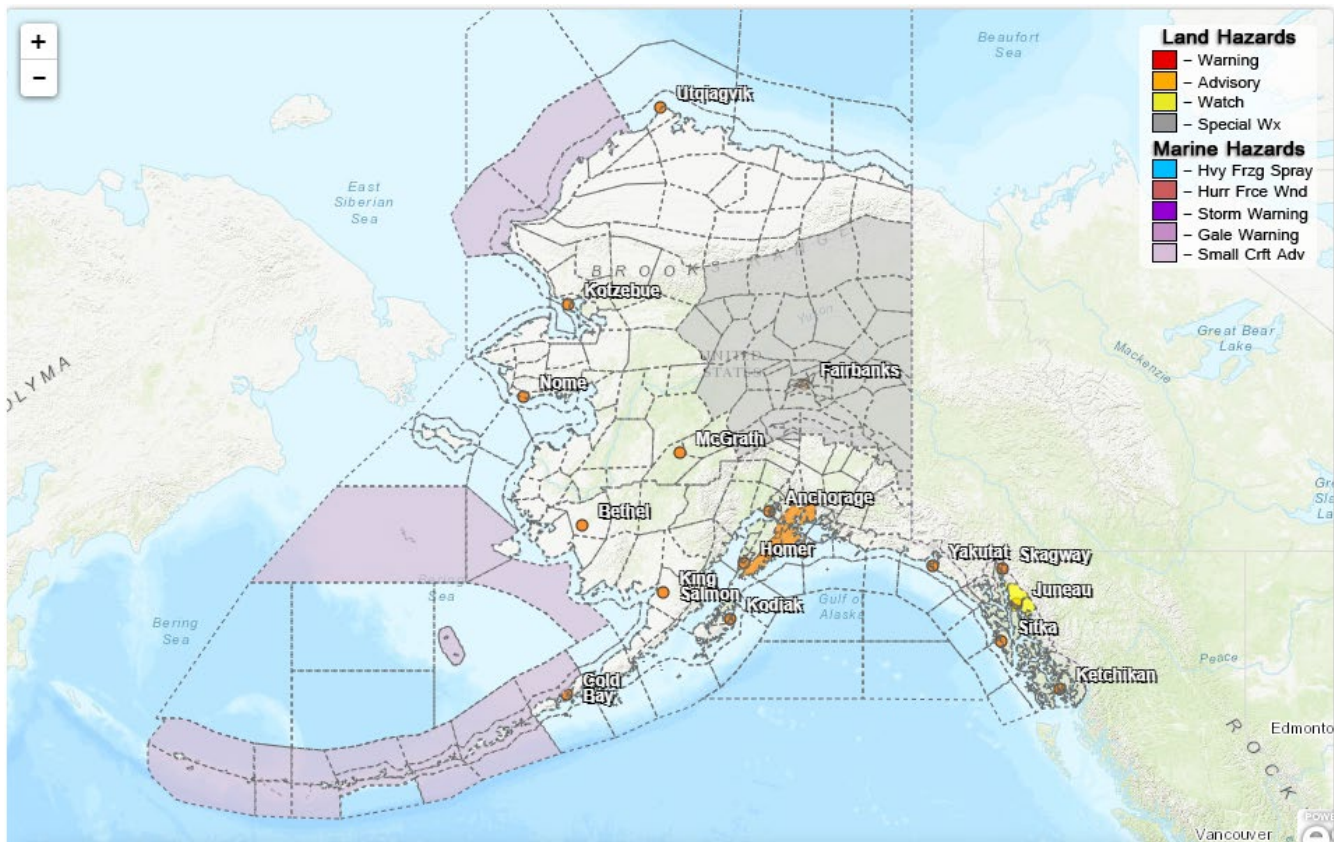
