Significant Issues:

Juneau Suicide Basin Flooding:

SEOC continues to have a Branch Director in Juneau to coordinate all State Disaster Response and Recovery operations with a focus on volunteer, donations, and Mass Care support. She deployed with the SEOC lead for VOADs and Salvation Army to assist with volunteer coordination. They are actively engaged with multiple partners including Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes in Mass Care work including food boxes, donations management, and preparing for "muck-out" and residential debris removal missions.

SEOC and the City and Borough of Juneau are so grateful for the tremendous work and support they have received from the Red Cross, Salvation Army, and all other voluntary organizations. Assessment of damages, management of resources and ongoing community support are vital in times of disaster.

SEOC Individual Assistance (IA) Group opened the State Disaster IA applications by phone and web site on Friday and plans to open a Disaster Assistance Center in Juneau the week of August 21. Web Site for IA Registration for the Juneau disaster is: https://ready.alaska.gov/Recovery/IA

SEOC is working with the Federal Emergency Management Agency to schedule a joint preliminary damage assessment in Juneau to assess flood damages and prepare for a potential request for federal assistance.

Statewide Wildland Fire Situation:

According to the daily Fire Weather Brief, wildland fire activity is on a slow decline across the State due to cooler temperatures and increased moisture expected. However, there remains some concern in areas of the state that have not yet received significant precipitation. There continues to be 8 staffed fires with over 1,000 fire personnel actively engaged and over 285,000 acres burned this year.

SEOC has the Mobile Emergency Operations Center deployed to the Anderson Fire Complex which will stay on scene until Thursday. The SEOC Operations Specialist will return to Anchorage today. The Alaska National Guard Armory in Fairbanks continues to support fire crew mobilization.


