Wrangell Landside Disaster:

SEOC is actively monitoring Point Hope's response with community officials and the North Slope Borough.

Savoonga Power Outage:

SEOC remains in close contact with community officials and with other agencies involved.

Selawik Power Outage:

SEOC, Northwest Arctic Borough and AKVOAD continue to work with the City of Selawik to support any unmet needs due to a power outage and freeze up.




Avalanche Hazards:

High Wind Watch

Central and Eastern Aleutians; Gusts up to 80 mph possible through Saturday evening

Winter Weather Advisory

- Municipality of Skagway until today at noon for snow between 1 to 2 inches.
- Southern Seward Peninsula Coast and St. Lawrence Island until today at 3pm for blowing snow and winds gusting to 45mph.
- Bering Strait Coast and Northern Arctic Coast until tonight at 6pm for blowing snow and winds gusting to 40mph.
- Central Brooks Range until Friday at 3pm for blowing snow and winds gusting to 45 mph.
- White Mountains and High Terrain South of the Yukon River until this afternoon at 3pm for blowing snow and winds gusting to 40 mph.

Blizzard Warning

- Central Arctic Plains and Central Beaufort Sea Coast until Friday at 6am.
- Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast until Friday at 3pm.
- Western Arctic Coast until Thursday at 3pm.

Winter Storm Watch

- Kuskokwim Delta; Wind gusts up to 55 mph and 3 inches of snow accumulation tell Saturday evening
- St Lawrence Island, Bering Strait Coast, and Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Wind gusts up to 60 mph with 3 inches of snowfall until Sunday night
- Yukon Delta Coast; Lower Yukon River, Middle Yukon Valley; Lower Yukon and Innoko Valleys wind speed up to 50 mph and snow fall 3-8 inches.

Special Weather Statement

 Northern Arctic Coast; Central Beaufort Sea Coast; Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast; Blizzard conditions into Monday.
