## How does PA Work?

Alaska – Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Management Disaster Assistance Public (infrastructure) Assistance

Federal – Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Public (infrastructure) Assistance

State/FEMA in partnership with local authorities assess damages and develop restoration projects and secure funds

Local Authorities manage projects, report progress, document costs, and request funds

Alaska PA Staff train local reps on programmatic, reporting, documentation and payment procedures. AK PA Staff also monitor progress, produce FEMA reports, and advocate for applicants to FEMA as needed.
