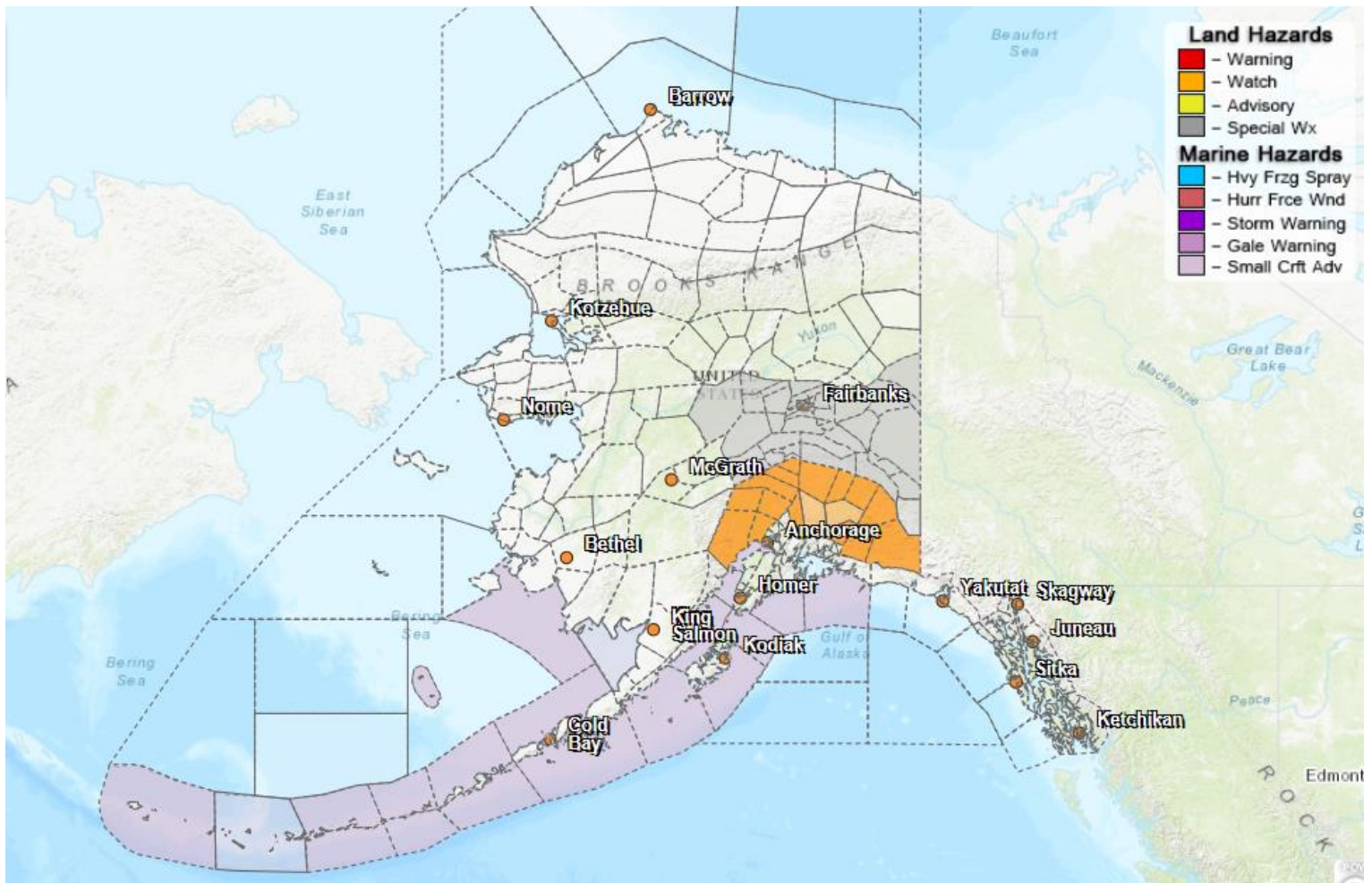
Statewide Cyber Incidents

The SEOC continues to monitor the response and recovery efforts by Matanuska-Susitna Borough (MSB) and the City of Valdez to their respective cyber incidents. The City of Valdez forwarded a draft local declaration with request for state assistance to the SEOC this morning; a final request is expected from the city in the next couple days.

Tuluksak Power Outage

The Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) confirms the power has been restored to Tuluksak for the past two days. The AEA contractor, Current River, should be on site Wednesday to replace the engine wiring harness and all fuel components.
