Cook Inlet Earthquake

The SEOC continues to be activated to Level 3 in response to the M7.0 earthquake affecting the Municipality of Anchorage, Matanuska-Susitna Borough, and Kenai Peninsula Borough. The State has activated the State Individual Assistance Program for earthquake survivors. 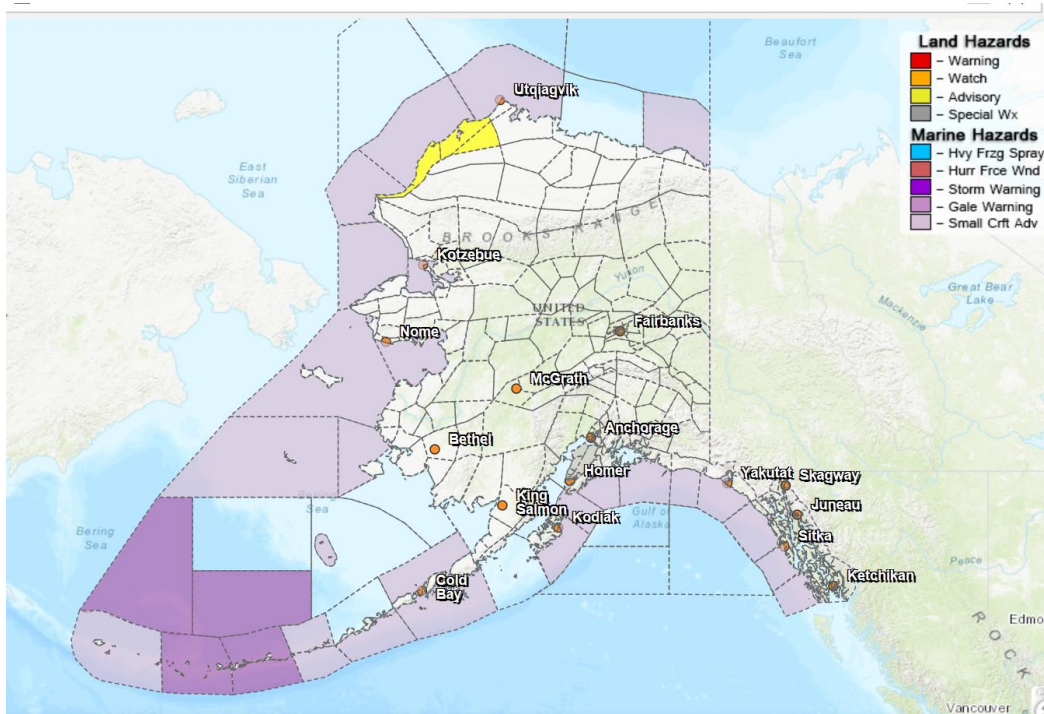
Thorne Bay Landslide

The SEOC was contacted by the Prince of Wales Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) about a recent landslide that covered the road from Thorne Bay to South Thorne Bay and Kasaan. The mayor of Thorne Bay has declared the event a local disaster and is seeking all available assistance from the State. The City specifically requests assistance with technical evaluation of the slide and the associated debris removal and other disaster-related costs. Today, a US Forest Service (USFS) geologist will evaluate the slide material for worker safety. The SEOC will check back with Thorne Bay for an update.
