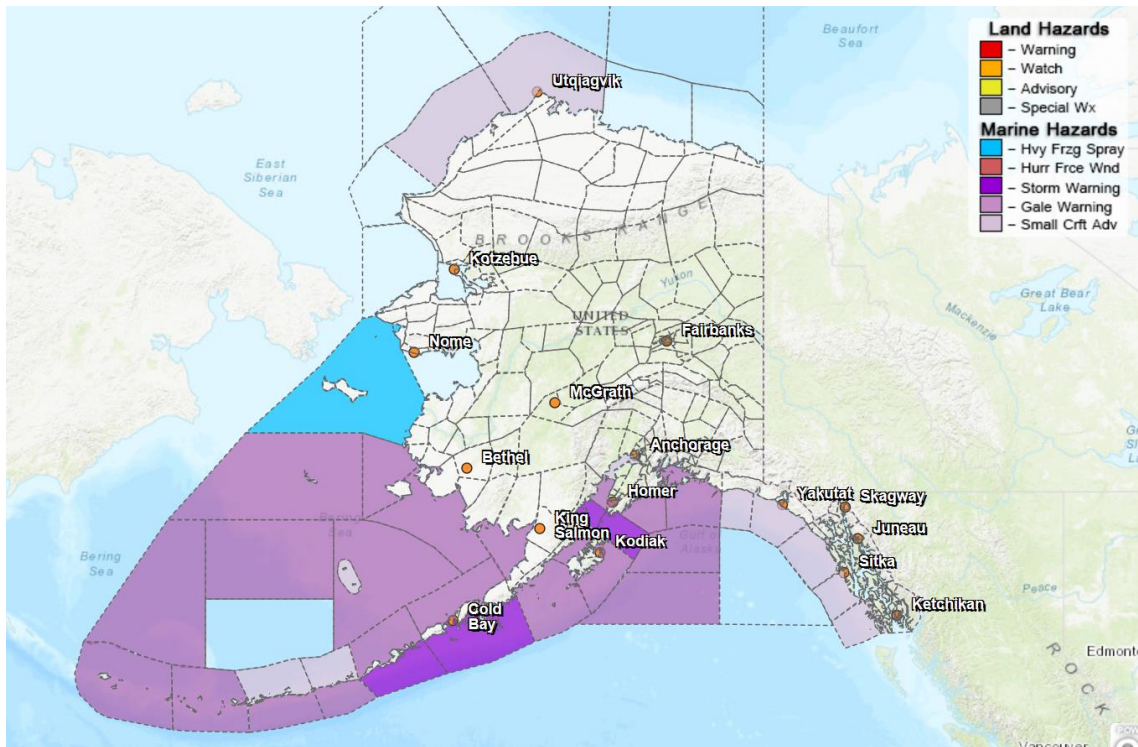

RiverWatch 2019

The progress of river ice breakup is significantly earlier this year. RiverWatch field teams met with the National Weather Service field teams yesterday in an attempt to firm up the schedule on when to begin flying the both the Yukon and Kuskokwim Rivers. Currently the proposed start date for the Kuskokwim is April 17 and the start date for the upper Yukon is still dependent on ice conditions and shifting near the community of Circle.
