

Significant Weather:



A winter weather advisory is in effect for the Susitna Valley Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula, Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, Norton Sound and Nulato Hills, Yukon Delta, Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills, Upper Koyukuk Valley, and Central Interior. These areas can expect snow throughout the weekend. Travel may be difficult and visibility may be limited by heavy snowfall.

A winter storm warning is in effect for the Upper Kuskokwim Valley, Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys, St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast, and the Yukon Valley. Heavy snow and wind are likely throughout the weekend. Travel may be difficult and visibility may be limited by heavy snowfall.

A high wind watch is in effect for the areas around Denali and the Eastern Alaskan Range.
