Health Mandate - School Closures:

The State of Alaska (SOA) Health Mandate 001 (3/13) dictates that all scheduled public school days through March 27, 2020 will be non-student contact days in which students will not be attending school. Schools have begun deployment of distance learning.

Child Care:

DHSS is fielding questions from licensed providers. Guidance was published in the SOA Health Alert 008 (3/17). Additional guidance will be provided as necessary.

Health Mandates - Social Distancing:

- SOA Health Mandate 009 (3/23) to limit all close contact (people outside of a family unit) to be further than six feet from each other to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Also mandated that there are no gatherings of more than 10 people and if there is 10 people or less, make sure 6ft social distances are observed.
- Some municipalities have signed Emergency Orders and announced additional public health protections in response to COVID-19, instituting additional social distancing measures. Some municipalities have also limited the number of people attending events. See local guidance for your area.

Food Distribution Programs

- Due to school closures, the school lunch program transitioned to alternative delivery. Local school districts are developing alternative means of providing school meals. The SEOC has been notified by the following:
 - Anchorage School District
 - Juneau School District
 - Bering Strait School District (Nome)
 - Valdez schools
- The Salvation Army is gathering information and assessing statewide feeding needs. The Salvation Army in Anchorage continues its home-delivered meals to nearly 400 seniors in Anchorage.

Statewide Positive Case Count total: 59 current/0 recovered/1* death/ 1860 tested

There are currently 59 confirmed cases in Alaska. Most are travel-associated cases of COVID-19, but community-acquired infections have begun to appear in Alaskan communities.

Transportation



Health Mandate – All Travelers Order for 14-day Self-Quarantine:

SOA Health Mandate 010 (3/23) orders a mandatory 14-day self-quarantine for both international & interstate travelers (resident or non-resident) traveling back to or within Alaska; failure to follow this order is punishable by the law.

US Canada Border Crossing

United States and Canada are temporarily restricting all non-essential travel across its borders. “Non-essential” travel includes travel that is considered tourism or recreational in nature.

IFR Flight conditions until noon today. Parks Hwy Hazardous MP276-344 Blowing Drifting Snow + Removal into this evening.

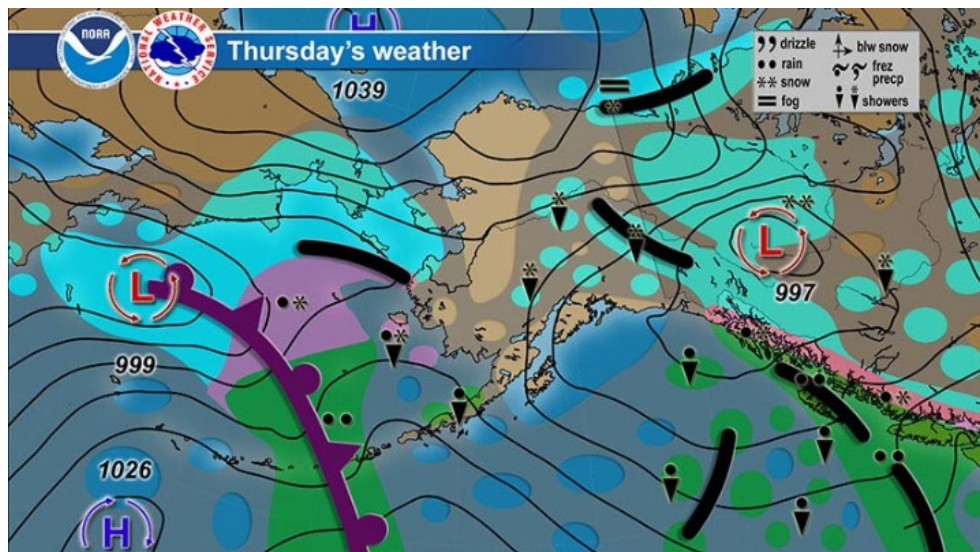
Ketchikan
