

Significant Weather:



A Blizzard Warning is in effect through 4:00 P.M. today for Thompson Pass and Northeast Prince William Sound. An additional 2 to 6 inches of snowfall and winds gusting to 35mph are expected.

A Winter Storm Warning is in effect until 1:00 P.M. today for Hyder. A total of 20 inches of snow accumulation is expected.

Wind Chill Advisories and Warnings are in effect for the following areas:

- Kuskokwim Delta, Western Arctic coast, Nulato Hills, and the Koyukuk and Yukon Valleys until noon today. Wind chills as low as 50°F below zero are possible.
- The Brooks Range until noon tomorrow. Wind chills as low as 70°F below zero are possible.

Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for the following areas:


- The Alaska Peninsula until 6:00 P.M. today. 1 to 6 inches of snow accumulation.
- Juneau until 11:00 P.M. today. 2 to 6 inches of snow accumulation.
- Western Kenai Peninsula until midnight tonight. 3 to 7 inches of snowfall and winds gusting to 30mph are possible.

Special Weather Statements remain in effect for the following areas:

- Central Interior, Upper Koyukuk Valley, and the Yukon Flats. Wind chills around 40°F below zero along the Dalton, Elliott and Steese Highways through Wednesday.
- Bristol Bay and Port Heiden through Tuesday night. Cold temperatures and blowing snow are possible through today.
- Southern Seward Peninsula and the western Interior. A major storm could impact the area late this weekend with high winds and heavy snowfall.
