Significant Issues:

East Fork Wildfire

The SEOC participated in multiple interagency calls today with local, regional, tribal, federal, and volunteer agencies regarding the East Fork wildfire that is burning north of St. Mary's. A type II incident management team as well as smoke jumpers, hand crews and multiple aircraft are being deployed to the fire. As of late this afternoon YKHC is assisting with the voluntary movement of community elders and medically fragile individuals from St. Mary's to Bethel. SEOC remains in contact with the Alaska Interagency Coordination Center, the Fire's Incident Management Team, and YKHC to assist with coordination of this event. The area of the fire remains under Red Flag conditions.
