Significant Issues:

Fairbanks Area Windstorm:

Last night Alaska State Troopers and Rural Deltana Volunteer Fire Chief advised SEOC of a severe windstorm impacting the Fairbanks area. Strong winds blew trees into power lines, causing widespread power outages. There was a 45-minute failure of the Fairbanks area 911 system. Multiple structure fires and wildland fires were ignited during the storm. The SEOC is in contact with the Fairbanks North Star Borough today to receive a preliminary damage report.

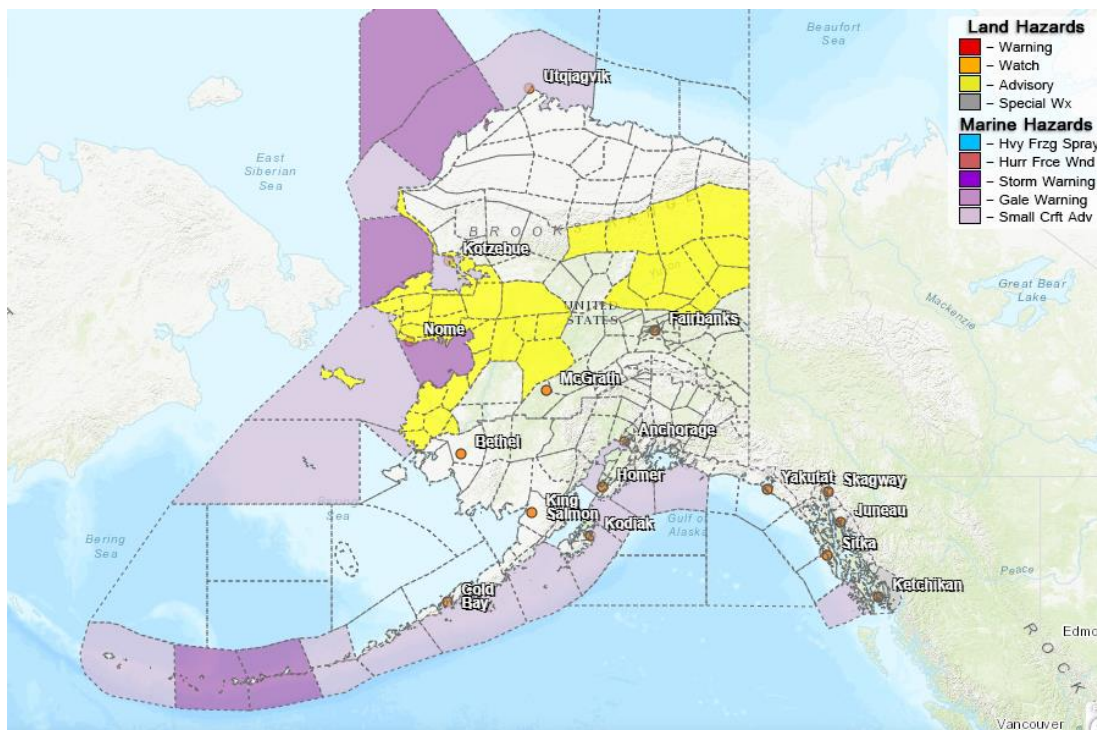

Significant Weather:



A Special Weather Statement remains in effect for the Slamon River near Hyder. Water levels are expected to rise for the next two days due to a glacier dammed lake release.

High Wind Advisories are in effect until 6:00 P.M. today for the Middle Yukon Valley, Yukon Flats and the Southeastern Brooks Range. Winds gusting to 45mph are possible.

A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect for Eastern Norton Sound and the Yukon Delta from Kotlik to Hooper Bay. Sea levels 3 to 6 feet above the normal high tide lines are possible.

High Surf Advisories are in effect for the Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, St. Lawrence Island and the Bering Strait Coast, the Chukchi Sea Coast as well as the Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula until noon tomorrow.
