

Significant Weather:



Blizzard warnings are in effect for the following areas:

- St. Lawrece Island and the Bering Strait Coast for blizzard conditions and 3 to 5 inches of snow accumulation. Winds are expected to gust up to 70mph.
- Southern Seward Peninsula Coast for blizzard conditions and 7 to 12 inches of snow. Winds are expected to gust up to 55mph.

Winter storm warnings are in effect for the following areas:

- Yukon Delta from 11pm tonight until 9am Sunday for snow accumulation of 3 to 5 inches and blowing snow, with winds gusting up to 55mph.
- Lower Yukon Valley from 3am Saturday until noon Sunday for snow accumulation of 8 to 12 inches and blowing snow.
- Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills from 6am Saturday until noon Sunday for 4 to 8 inches
 of snow accumulation and winds gusting up to 50mph.

Winter storm watches are in effect for the following areas:

- Chukchi Sea Coast, Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley starting Saturday afternoon through Sunday morning for heavy snow accumulation up to 4 inches and winds gusting up to 55mph.
- Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys from Saturday afternoon through Sunday evening for snow accumulation of 4 to 10 inches

Winter weather advisories are in effect for the following areas:


- Kuskokwim delta from midnight tonight to 3pm Saturday for 2 to 4 inches of snow and blowing snow conditions.
- Bristol Bay from 3am Saturday until 6pm Saturday for 3 to 6 inches of snow and winds as high as 40mph causing blowing snow.

Special weather statements are in effect for for the following areas:

- Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, St. Lawrence Island, Bering Strait Coast and the Yukon delta for elevated water levels of 2 to 3 feet along the coast through Saturday morning.
- Baldwin Peninsula, Chukchi Sea Coast, Eastern Norton Sound, Nulato Hills, Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Upper Kobuk Valley, Lower Koyukuk, and Middle Yukon Valleys, Lower Yukon Valley for signifigant snow and possible blizzard conditions through Sunday.

Avalanche Forecast:



Areas near valdez have considerable advisory levels as low as 2,000ft.

Areas near Haines, Klukwan, and Mosquito Lake have Moderate advisory levels from 1,500ft to 2,500 ft and considerable advisory levels above 2,500ft.
