

### Significant Weather:




Winter Storm Warning remains in effect for the City and Borough of Yakutat from 6pm Thursday until 10am Friday for snow accumulation of 4 to 8 inches and winds gusting to 45mph.

Winter Storm Warning remains in effect for the Municipality of Skagway, Haines, and Klukwan until 11pm Thursday for heavy snow accumulation of 6 to 17 inches and winds gusting to 45mph.

A Special Weather statement has been issued for the northern Panhandle for the expectation of heavy rain to follow the snow and wintry mix that is currently progressing over the region. Rain will be the heaviest through Thursday night.

#### **Avalanche Forecast:**



- Haines moderate avalanche conditions above 1,500ft and low below 1,500 ft.
- Valdez Low avalanche danger at all elevations.
- Cordova area: Considerable advisory level above1,000 ft and Moderate advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass Low advisory level at all elevations.
- Hatcher Pass Moderate advisory level at all elevations and on slopes 35° and steeper.
