#### Significant Issues:

#### **Teller Water and Fuel Shortage**

The SEOC conducted a multi-agency call with the City and Native Village of Teller, Kawerak, Norton Sound Health Corporation (NSHC), Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), voluntary agencies and other stakeholders yesterday. Donations of 60 pallets of bottled water, 20 cases of personal care wipes, a pallet of household cleansing wipes and other requested items are expected to begin arriving in Teller over the next couple of days. NSHC has provided a remote maintenance worker, technical assistance, hoses, and pumps which will allow transfer of water from the wells at Coyote Creek to a water truck and then to households. The Native Village of Teller believes they have enough fuel to meet community needs until the June fuel barge arrives. The SEOC will continue to work with identified agencies and voluntary partners to support Teller until repairs to its water system are completed.


## Significant Weather:

## **Avalanche Forecast:**



- Valdez Moderate avalanche advisory at all levels.
- Haines Moderate advisory above 2,500ft, Considerable advisory between 1,500ft and 2,500ft and moderate advisory level below 1,500ft.
- Cordova area Moderate advisory level above 1,000 ft, low advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass: Avalanche danger is considerable above 2,500ft and moderate below 2,500ft.
- Hatcher Pass Avalanche danger is moderate at all levels.
