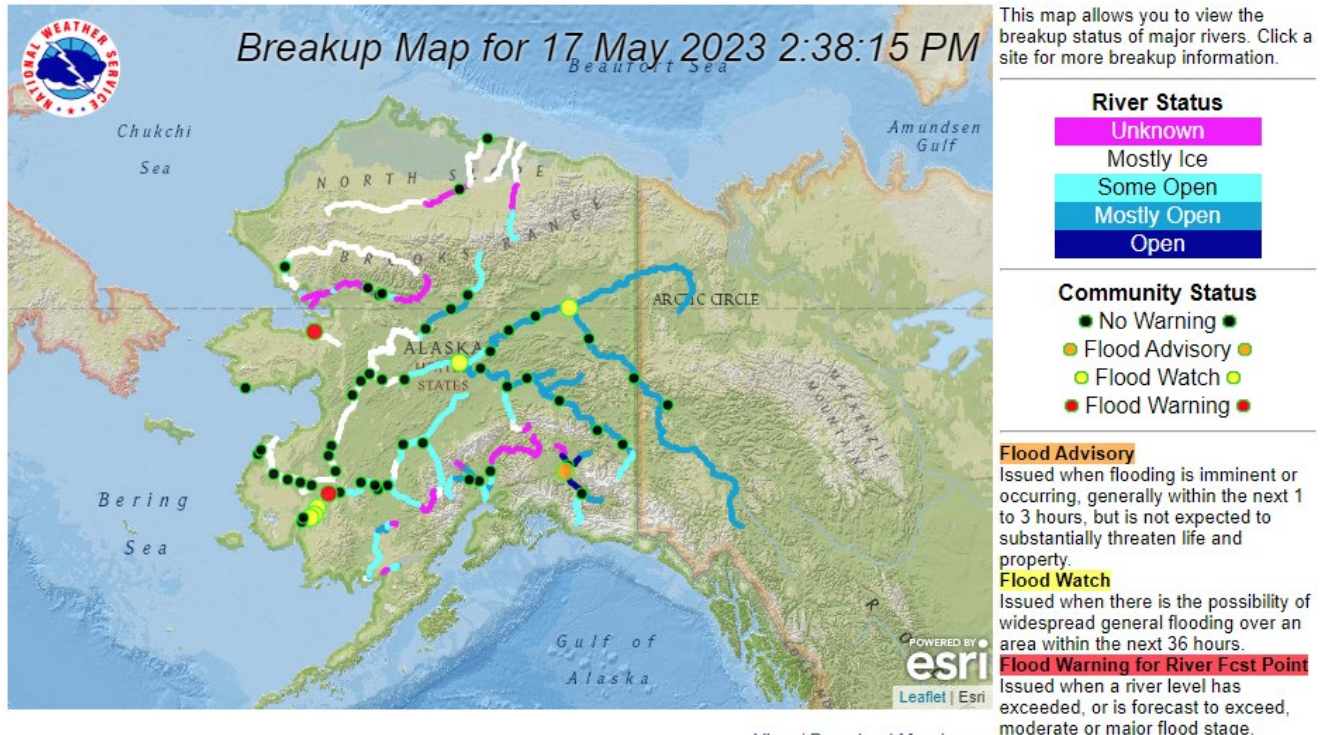

A strong Western Alaska storm is impacting the west coast of Alaska focused from Nome to Golovin with shoreline ice shove, high winds, high surf 1-4' above normal tide, and rain to 1" possible. No community impacts reported at this time.

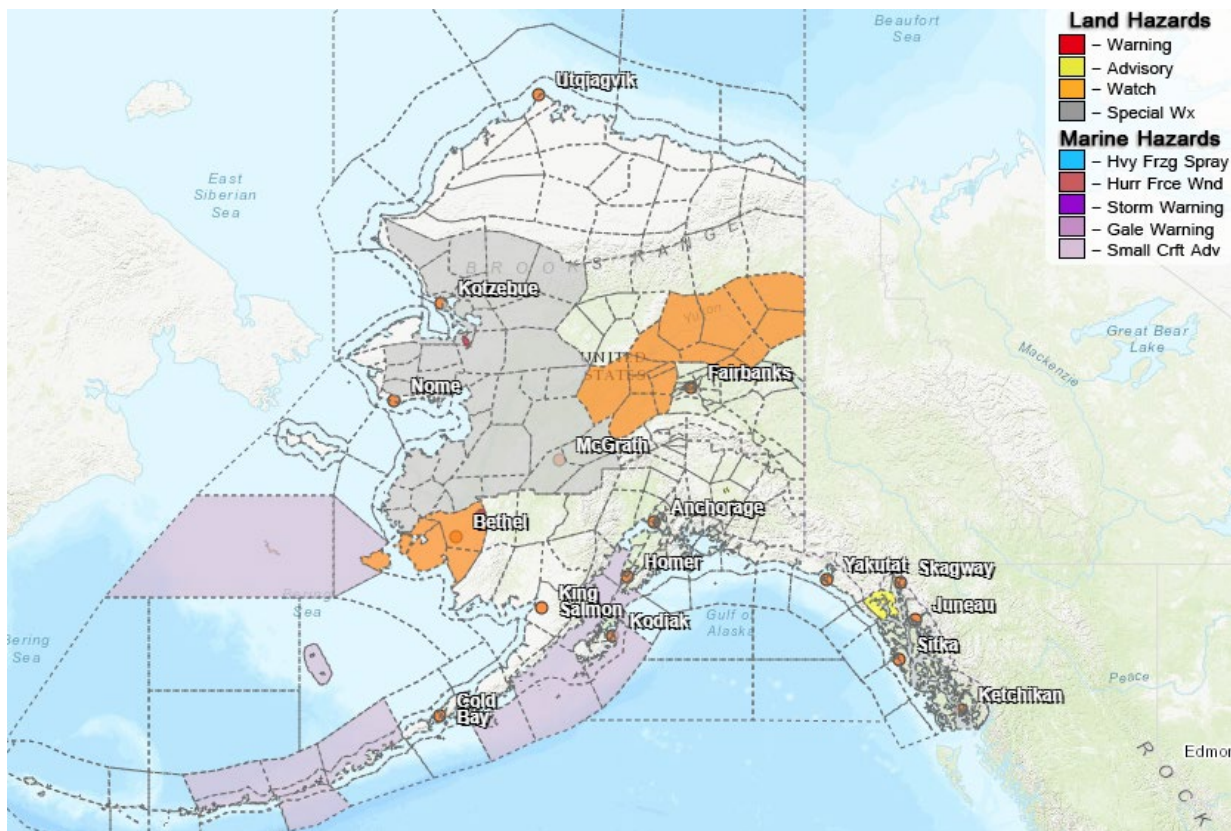

Significant Weather:



Yukon Flats and Surrounding Uplands: Flood Watch for snowmelt in effect through Sunday morning until May 21 at 10:00 am AKT for Porcupine River from the border to Fort Yukon.

Central Interior: Flood Watch for an ice jam remains in effect until 6:00 pm AKDT for the Yukon River at Tanana.

Kuskokwim Delta: Flood Warning for an ice jam now in effect until 7:00 pm AKDT Thursday along the Kuskokwim River near Kalskag Flood Watch for an ice jam in effect through Thursday evening along the Kuskokwim River Downstream of Kalskag to Kwethluk.

Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula: Flood Warning for flooding caused by an ice jam in effect until 11:00 pm AKDT Wednesday for Buckland.

Copper River Basin: Flood Advisory for snowmelt remains in effect until 9:30 am AKDT Thursday along the Old Edgerton Highway near the Richardson Highway and a Flood Advisory for snowmelt remains in effect until 12:45 pm AKDT Thursday for the Moose Creek near Glennallen.

Denali; Eastern Alaska Range; Deltana and Tanana Flats: Wind Advisory remains in effect until 6:00 am AKDT Wednesday.

Chukchi Sea Coast; Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys; Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley; Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills; St Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast; Yukon Delta; Lower Yukon Valley; Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys; Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys; Upper Kuskokwim Valley: Special Weather Statement issued for elevated water levels and local runoff possible next week.
