Significant Issues:

Chalkyitsik – Power Outage

SEOC received a report from the TCC RMW program that Chalkyitsik lost power on Friday. TCC received an email from the clinic that the clinic generator was out due to lack of fuel and has not been able to contact anyone in the community since. SEOC has also attempted to contact the community through ANTHC, local air carriers, Yukon Flats School District, and DOT&PF but has been unsuccessful. SEOC will continue to work with TCC, DOH and partner agencies to contact the community for an updated report.

Koyukuk – Freeze Up

SEOC was contacted by the Koyukuk Native Village regarding a water freeze up due to a broken water pump. Water has been out to the entire community including the washeteria, school, clinic, and tribal office, for the past week. Repairs have been hampered by extreme cold weather. Tanana Chiefs Conference Rural Maintenance Worker began trouble shooting last week. A new water pump is being ordered and is expected to take at least two weeks to arrive. The community has requested assistance with bottled water and shelf stable food. Alaska Voluntary Agencies Active in Disasters are working with the community on food and water request. There are no other requests currently. SEOC will continue to monitor the situation.

Mertarvik – Power Outage

SEOC was notified today that the community had intermittent power outages during the weekend, the longest lasting 4 hours AEA will have a new generator and parts on site by early next week. Local operators will monitor the generator through the week with technical support from AEA. Resources from the BIA that were scheduled to fly out Friday were delayed all weekend due to weather conditions. Fox Air is going is attempting today to make the first of approximately four deliveries.

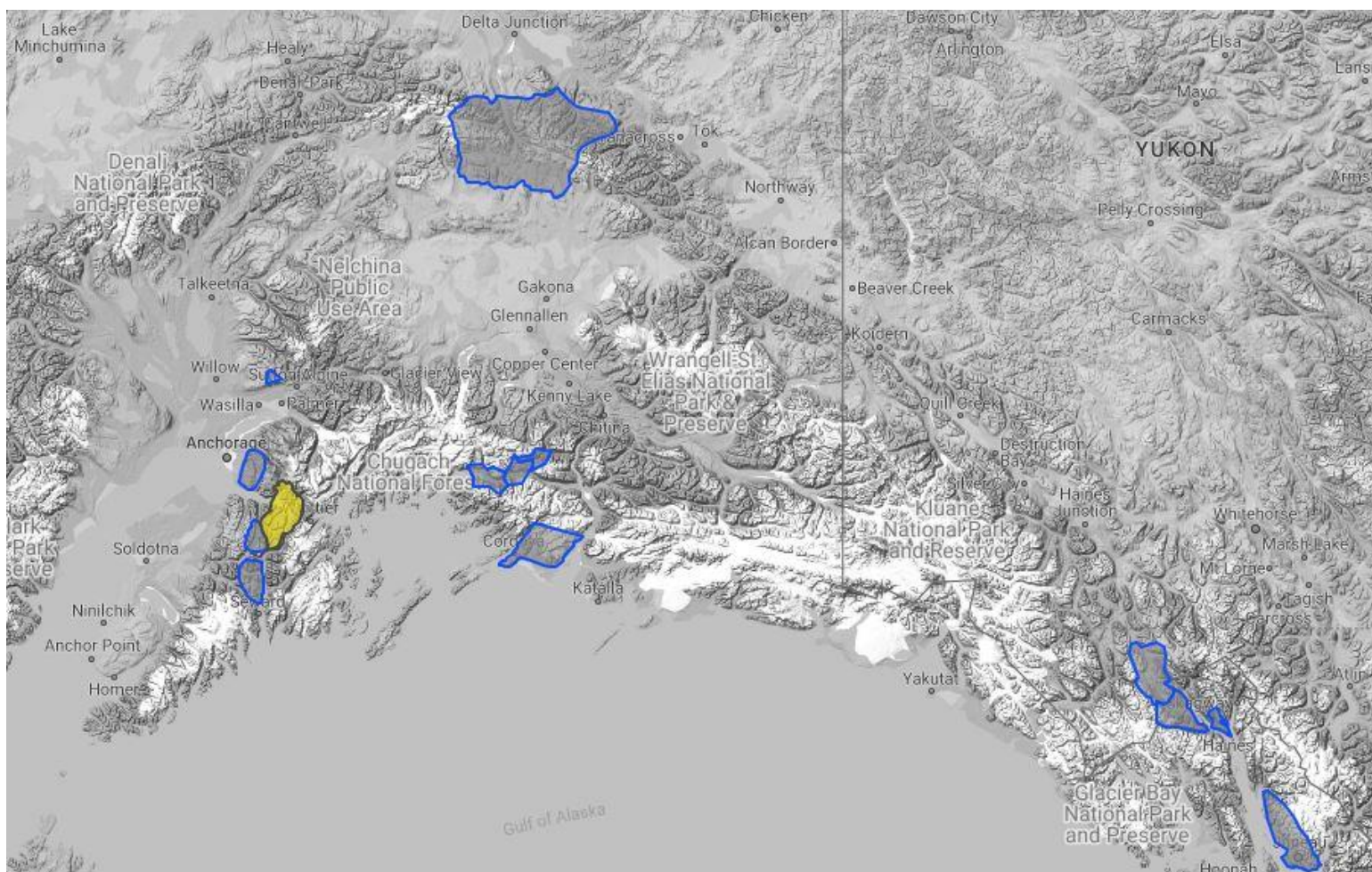

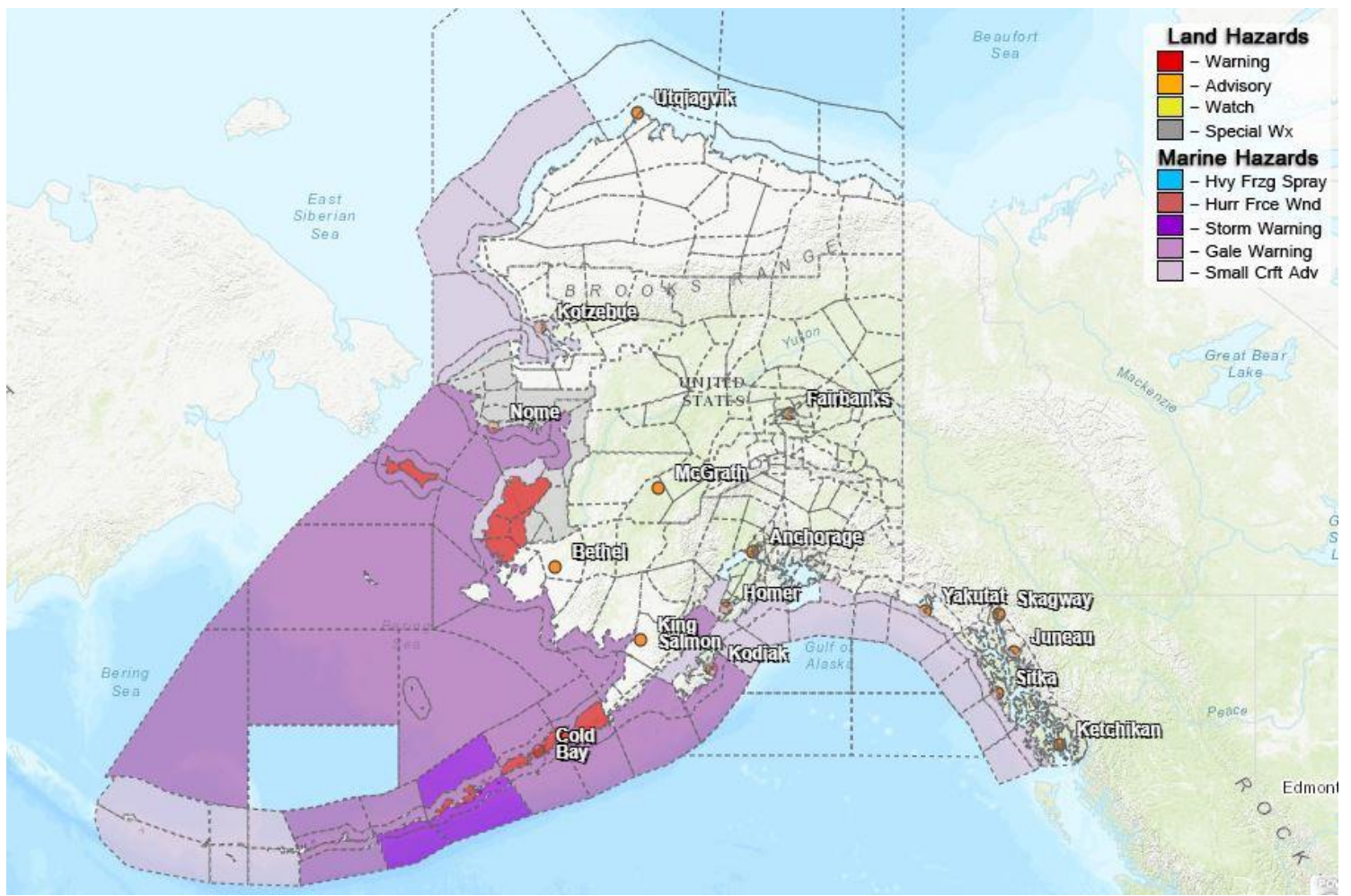
Avalanche Hazards:
