


Diomede Water Shortage

The SEOC is monitoring efforts to address a water supply issue in Diomede that began last Thursday, April 11. Norton Sound Health Corporation (NSHC) believes a failed water pump at the Diomede water treatment plant is the cause of the disruption that has stopped water flow to the school, clinic and washeteria. These buildings are the only facilities served by the water system; the rest of the community hauls water from the washeteria. A NSHC Remote Maintenance Worker (RMW) and Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium's (ANTHC) Tribal Utility Support team are providing technical assistance and plan to travel to Diomede Tuesdayto assess the situation. DEC reports ANTHC does have a limited amount of emergency funding that can be used in cases such as this, but it is limited to \$5,000 per community. This may be enough to buy replacement pumps, if needed. NHSC has reached out to US Senators Sullivan and Murkowski to make them aware of this situation.
