Significant Issues:

Wildland Fires

The SEOC continues to support wildland fire operations. The SEOC finalized plans to open two Disaster Assistance Centers (DACs) for the McKinley Fire; one at the Upper Susitna Senior Center in Talkeetna, and the other at the United Methodist Church in Willow, starting today. The SEOC continues operations to implement the State Public Assistance, Individual Assistance (IA), and Temporary Housing programs pursuant to Governor's State Disaster Declaration for the Matanuska Susitna Borough and Kenai Peninsula Borough. Volunteer, faith-based, and other Mass Care agencies are engaged in supporting survivors with emergency supplies and relief actions.

Water Shortages

The SEOC continues to work with the Lake and Peninsula and Kenai Peninsula Boroughs, Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation, regional tribal health organizations, and volunteer and faith-based organizations to support the following communities that have reported water shortages. These include Chignik Lagoon, Seldovia, Chignik Lake, Tatitlek, Nanwalek, and Cordova.

2019 Fire Season


The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center, (AICC) is at Preparedness Level 2.

- Total Fires = 699
- Total Acres = 2,594,156.4 There are currently 197 active fires with 6 fires currently staffed.

A dense fog advisory is in effect until this afternoon for cape fairweather to cape suckling coastal area.
