Significant Issues:

The SEOC is monitoring a storm related power outage in Diomede. The SEOC has been in contact with the community, assisting agencies and the local government specialist. Repairs are expected as soon as Sunday afternoon. No injuries or other reports of damage were reported and there are no requests for additional State assistance at this time. SEOC will continue to monitor the situation and maintain regular contact with the community.



Significant Weather:



A special weather statement has been issued for Western Prince William Sound. A frontal system may bring heavy accumulating snow to the eastern Kenai Peninsula from Seward to Whittier, including Turnagain Pass. Snow is possible beginning late Tuesday and lasting through Wednesday.

A special weather statement has been issued for the Susitna Valley. Snow is possible beginning late Tuesday night and lasting through Wednesday.

A special weather statement has been issued for the Juneau Borough and Northern Admiralty Islands. Scattered snow showers will occasionally mix with rain early Monday and then become widespread snow showers. Accumulations of 1-4 inches of snow are expected through tonight.

A special weather statement has been issued for the Salisbury Sound to Cape Fairweather Coastal Area, Cape Fairweather to Cape Suckling Coastal area, the Eastern Chicagof Islands, and Glacier Bay. Numerous snow showers will mix with rain early Monday, then become scattered snow showers.

A winter storm warning is in effect for the Central Interior, Upper Koyukuk Valley, Southeastern Brooks Range, Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Chukchi Sea Coast, Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys, Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley, Lower Yukon Valley, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills, Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula, the Yukon Delta, and the St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast.

A winter storm watch is in effect for the Upper Kuskokwim Valley, Northeastern Brooks Range, Western Arctic Coast, and the Northwestern Brooks Range.

A high surf advisory is in effect through Wednesday afternoon for the St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast.

A wind advisory is in effect through Wednesday morning for the Upper Kuskokwim Valley.

A coastal flood warning is in effect through Wednesday afternoon for the Chukchi Sea Coast, Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, the Yukon Delta, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills.

A coastal flood watch is in effect for the Northern Arctic Coast through Thursday morning.

A coastal flood advisory is in effect through Tuesday afternoon for the Kuskokwim Delta and Bristol Bay.
