## **Incident Overview / Timeline of Significant Events**

- 3/11 Governor Dunleavy declares a Public Health Disaster Emergency.
- 3/14 Governor Dunleavy announces the first confirmed case of COVID-19 in Alaska.
- 3/20 Governor Dunleavy announces Alaska COVID-19 Economic Stabilization Plan
- 3/25 First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 3/27 First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 3/28 Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 4/3 Case count in the state exceeds 150.
- 4/7 Case count in the state exceeds 200.
- 4/9 President Trump approves a major disaster declaration for Alaska.
- 4/11 Case count in the state exceeds 250.
- 4/16 Case count in the state exceeds 300.
- 4/28 Case count in the state exceeds 350.
- 5/20 Case count in the state exceeds 400.

## **Reopen Alaska Responsibly Plan:**

<u>Health Mandate 16</u> includes updates to multiple existing mandates as part of a phased reopening of the state economy.

Effective at 8:00am Friday May 22, 2020 Alaska is reopened.

It remains the responsibility of individuals, businesses, and organizations to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Alaskans are encouraged to follow guidelines on ways to reinstitute activities safely.

#### **International & Interstate Travel:**

<u>Health Mandate 10</u> orders a mandatory 14-day self-quarantine for both international & interstate travelers (resident or non-resident) traveling to Alaska; failure to follow this order is punishable by law.

\*HM 10 has been extended until June 2, 2020.

#### Interior


- Friday: Rapid fire ignition, growth and spread possible in the Yukon Flats.
