#### Significant Issues

#### Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic

On March 11, 2020, Alaska Governor Mike Dunleavy issued a declaration of public health disaster emergency in response to the COVID-19 anticipated outbreak. The declaration initiates a unified command structure between the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS), Alaska Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA), and the Department of Public Safety (DPS), and fully engages state departments to utilize all capabilities to ensure a swift and effective COVID-19 response. A unified command has been established at the SEOC. The SEOC Preparedness Level remains at Level 2 – Heightened Awareness.

### State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS)

DHSS is closely monitoring the rapidly-emerging outbreak of (COVID-19). On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) determined that COVID-19 can be characterized as a pandemic.



#### **Series of Storms Coming to Interior Alaska This Week**

A weather front approaching the West Coast of Alaska today, will move east across the Interior tonight and Tuesday. This front will bring several inches of snow to the Interior tonight and Wednesday, and bring a slight chance of freezing rain to the southern Interior tonight and Wednesday as well. A second, and much stronger storm, will move into the West Coast of Alaska Wednesday night, and to move east across the Interior Thursday and Friday. This is expected to bring and more snow to the Eastern Interior Thursday through Friday.
