



#### Significant Weather:



A flood watch is in effect through Tuesday morning for the Salcha River near the bridge. An ice jam remains in place at the Salcha River Bridge, and is causing high water upstream of the bridge. Additional ice and water that is flowing down the river may cause the water level to rise rapidly as its hits the ice jam. People along the Salcha River near the Bridge should be alert to the possibility of rapidly rising water. The threat of flooding will end when the ice jam breaks free.

A flood advisory is in effect for minor ice jam flooding near the Chena River along Freeman Road east of Nordale Road.

A high wind watch is in effect from Tuesday morning through late Tuesday night for Dixon Entrance to Cape Decision Coastal Area and the Southern Inner Channels.

A special weather statement has been issued for localized flooding across the interior. Rapid snow melt last week is causing minor flooding of numerous low lying areas across Interior Alaska. Many creeks, sloughs and rivers are high, with water running on top of the ice and some ice jams. Areas that currently have minor flooding will likely have high water remaining for a few more days. Cooler night time temperatures across the Interior this weekend have slowed down the snow melt, and some locations are seeing water levels falling slowly.
