The SEOC received a report of a magnitude 6.3 earthquake 25 miles east of Nikolski this morning at 0730 hrs. The SEOC contacted communities within 100 miles of the earthquake who all reported strong shaking but no damage or injuries. The SEOC continues to monitor for additional reports.

A unified command has been established at the SEOC. The SEOC continues to support statewide response to COVID-19.



Significant Weather:



A Winter Weather Advisory has been issued for the following areas:

- Bristol Bay until 9:00 A.M. today. 4 to 9 inches of snow accumulation with winds gusting to 40mph are expected from Dillingham north to Bristol Bay, including New Stuyahok and Koliganek.
- Lower Kuskokwim Valley until 4:00 P.M. today. 4 to 8 inches of snow accumulation is expected.
- Anchorage until noon today. Freezing rain and drizzle is expected throughout the area.
- Central & Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast until 9:00 P.M. today. Winds gusting to 40mph will create blowing snow causing areas of whiteout and snowdrifts.
- Southeastern Brooks Range until 6:00 A.M. Wednesday. 3 to 6 inches of snow accumulation are expected with localized amounts of up to 14 inches.
- Upper Koyukuk, Kobuk and Noatak Valley until 6:00 A.M. Wednesday. 3 to 6 inches of snow accumulation with localized amounts of up to 12 inches.

A Winter Storm Warning has been issued for the following areas:

- Northern & Western Susitna Valley until 1:00 P.M. tomorrow. 12 to 24 inches of snow accumulation. The heaviest snowfall is expected north and west of Talkeetna, including the Parks Highway north of Talkeetna up to Cantwell.
- Haines Borough, Lynn Canal, and the Klondike Highway today until 5:00 P.M. today.
 18 to 30 inches of snow with winds gusting to 45mph.

A High Wind Warning has been issued for the flowing areas:

- o Denali until 3:00 P.M. tomorrow. South winds of 40 to 55mph with gusts to 70mph.
- Eastern Alaska Range until 3:00 P.M. tomorrow. South winds of 40 to 60 mph with gusts to 70mph.
- Juneau Borough and Northern Admiralty Island until 3:00 P.M. today. South winds of 35 to 45mph with gusts to 65mph.

A Flood Watch has been issued for the following areas:

- Taiya Inlet & Klondike Highway tonight until 3:00 A.M. Thursday. Rainfall totals from 5 to 10 inches are expected.
- Juneau & Haines Boroughs and the surrounding areas until 5:00 P.M. today. Rainfall totals from 5 to 10 inches are expected along with a storm system causing significant snowmelt throughout the area.

A Flood Advisory is in effect for the Eastern Kenai Peninsula including Seward, until 6:30 A.M. tomorrow. 4 to 4.5 inches of rainfall is expected, with locally higher amounts possible. The heaviest rainfall is expected from Tuesday morning through Wednesday morning. Snow levels will rise to 2,000-2,500' by Tuesday and minor flooding is expected from Moose Pass south to Seward, especially across roadways and in frozen drainage areas.

A Wind Advisory is in effect until 3:00 P.M. today. South winds of 30 to 45mph with gusts to 50mph are possible in the area.

A Special Weather Statement is in effect for the Kuskokwim Delta. A weather system moving inland tonight will bring gusty winds and snow accumulations of 1 to 3 inches across the area.

A Special Weather Statement is in effect for the Western Interior Region for today and tomorrow. A front moving into the area will bring snow with 6 to 12 inches of accumulation expected from Ambler south to McGrath.
