Significant Issues:

River Watch 2022

The SEOC Kuskokwim Division began Riverwatch aerial surveillance of the river over the weekend and plans to have daily Kuskokwim community briefing calls at 1600 hrs to report river ice conditions.

River ice conditions along the Kuskokwim south of Tuluksak are beginning to mush out, while ice conditions up river of Aniak are still showing solid ice and ample amounts of snow pack in the hills.

The Kuskokwim Division will continue to meet with local, regional and tribal organizations in the region to discuss emergency flood plans, river ice conditions and potential ice jam flooding concerns.

Bi-weekly incident specific River Watch Situation Reports will be produced on Tuesday and Thursday each week and disseminated the following day.
