Significant Issues:

Major Coastal Sea Storms

Overall incident operations for the 2022 September West Coast Storm (DR-4672) disaster have transitioned from response in the SEOC to recovery coordinated through the State/FEMA Joint Field Office (JFO). Mass care operations will continue to be coordinated through the SEOC through November 11th and then transition to the JFO for long-term and occasional Mass Care support for feeding and interim housing identification.



Significant Weather:



Winter Weather Advisories have been issued for the following areas:

- Port Heiden to Iliamna from 8:00 A.M. today through 6:00 P.M. today. Two inches of snow and winds gusting to 60mph.
- Kuskokwim Delta until 4:00 P.M. today. 4 inches of snow and winds gusting to 45 mph.
- Denali Eastern Alaska Range until noon today. 8 to 11 inches of total snowfall.
- Upper Tanana Valley until noon today. An additional 2 inches of snowfall and winds gusting to 35mph.
- Yukon Delta and the Lower Yukon Valley until 6:00 P.M. today. An additional 5 inches
 of snowfall is possible with winds gusting to 25mph.

High Wind Watches have been issued for the following areas:

- Northeast Prince William Sound for tonight through Sunday morning. Northeast winds of 40 to 60 mph with gusts to 80 mph are likely from Thompson Pass through Valdez.
- Matanuska Valley from Saturday morning through Sunday morning. 30 to 40 mph winds with gusts to 75 mph.

A High Surf Advisory remains in effect until noon today for the Chukchi Sea Coast near Shishmaref. Northwest winds of up to 35mph may cause high surf and beach erosion.
