Significant Issues:

Stebbins Fire:

Stebbins obtained a 500-gal fuel tank with meter and \$85,000 of heating fuel from the NSCDC and will supply heating oil to each house hold to hold them over until the local fuel/gas company is set back up.

Bering Straits Native Corporation coordinated with Alaska VOAD, and Alaska Airlines to arrange shipment of 320 pounds of relief supplies including diapers, formula, wipes, feminine hygiene supplies, Pedialyte and UHT to Nome The supplies will be sent on to Stebbins as soon as a weather window opens. VOAD partners still have remaining items to send next week. Additionally, AK Missions, out of Soldotna is planning to transport very similar items to Stebbins today via their plane.

Department of Health WIC and SNAP teams are communicating with the 68 WIC recipients in Stebbins, to ensure that everyone is utilizing online ordering to reduce potential for interruption in assistance. Households enrolled in SNAP program will be able to use their benefits at the AC Store in S. Michael until food is available in Stebbins. Both are sharing information via social medial to ensure information is widely available.



Significant Weather:



The following Winter Storm Warnings remain in effect:

- Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley until 9:00 this morning.
- Western Arctic Coast until noon today.
- St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast until 6:00 pm this evening.
- Chukchi Sea Coast through noon today.
- Upper and Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys until noon today.
- Northeastern Brooks Range through noon today.
- Central Beaufort Sea Coast through 3:00PM Saturday. Heavy mixed precipitation. Additional snow accumulations of 5 to 8 inches and ice accumulations of up to one tenth of an inch and winds gusting as high as 60 mph.

The following Winter Weather Advisory has been issued:


Northeastern Brooks Range until noon today.
