Significant Issues:

Southcentral Snow Storm:

Another snow storm beginning Sunday evening and into Monday morning has impacted Southcentral Alaska. Reports of more than 12 to 15 inches of snow across the region have closed some schools in the Western Kenai Peninsula, in addition, Anchorage and Matsu School districts have also closed school again today for the fourth consecutive day. Stebbins Store Fire:

The SEOC is reviewing a signed copy of a local emergency declaration, the SEOC will continue to work with state, local, tribal and volunteer agencies to assist the community with the response and recovery for the store fire.



Significant Weather:



Avalache warnings are in effect for the following areas:

• Northeast and Western Prince William Sound, including the mountains in and around Valdez and Thompson Pass until 6pm Monday for a high danger level for avalanche conditions.

Winter storm warnings are in effect for the following areas:

- Anchorage until 9am Monday for snow accumulation of 12 to 16 inches in town and 16 to 20 along the hillside.
- Matanuska and Susitna Valley until noon Monday for an additional 2 to 4 inches of snow fall.
- Western Kenai Peninsula until 9am Monday for an additional 3 to 6 inches of snow fall, with gusting winds up to 30mph.
- Copper River Basin until 9pm for an additional 8 to 15 inches of snow.
- Upper Tanana Valley and Fortymile Country through 6pm today. For snow accumulation of 5 to 19 inches.

Winter weather advisories are in effect for the following areas:


- Cape Fairweather and Glacier Bay until noon Monday for 4 to 6 inches of snow.
- City and Burough of Juneau, Haines and Klukwan until 9pm Monday for snow accumulation of 4 to 6 inches with 5 to 7 inches in Juneau.
- Central Interior, Denali, Middle Tanana Valley, Deltana and Tanana Flats through 6pm Monday for 3 to 5 inches of snow.

• Eastern Alaska Range through 6pm Monday for 6 to 12 inches of snow.

Flood advisory in effect for the Susitna Valley until 1145 Thursday for flooding caused by freeze up and ice movement along the Willow Creek watershed upstream of Friday Road.

Areas near valdez have considerable advisory levels below 2,000ft and High advisory levels from 2,00ft to above 4,000 ft.

Areas near Cordova have a low advisory level below 2,000 ft and a moderate advisory level above 2,000 ft.
