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State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) Activated to Level 2

Incident Overview

On Monday, November 20th at 2051hrs the City and Borough of Wrangell experienced a major landslide at mile 11 of Zimovia Highway. The State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) was notified of the landslide at 2130 hrs. on November 20th, recalled staff, activated to Level-2 and is coordinating multiple requests for state-level resources in support of Wrangell's Incident Command.

On November 21st, 2023, Alaska Governor Mike Dunleavy declared a state disaster emergency for the City and Borough of Wrangell. On November 26th, 2023, Governor Dunleavy also declared a state disaster for the City of Coffman Cove.

Significant Operations Updates

Wrangell City and Borough:

On Tuesday, November 28th the SEOC Wrangell Field Division Supervisor demobilized, and all SEOC operations in Wrangell are now consolidated under the Wrangell City Division Supervisor. SEOC will transition the Wrangell Division Supervisor personnel on Friday, December 1st. SEOC intends ongoing inperson on-ground SEOC Division Supervisor level support for the City and Borough of Wrangell until no longer needed. Wrangell Division Supervisor is engaged with City and Borough search, roadway, mass care, tribal coordination, Individual Assistance, and recovery support.

The Department of Public Safety (DPS), in coordination with the Wrangell Incident Command, continues to support a reactive search strategy for the missing victims. Friday, search personnel located and recovered a deceased juvenile. Two individuals; one adult and one juvenile, remain missing.

The Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) in coordination with the City and Borough of Wrangell completed clearing of two lanes of the Zimovia Highway over the weekend. The road remains closed to non-emergency traffic, though Wrangell Police have implemented a limited access residential schedule. DOT&PF continues work around the slide area with heavy equipment and Unmanned Aerial Systems to assess slide stability, risk, and to support ongoing search operations. DOT&PF will deploy an on-scene weather station to provide real-time weather data for responder and crew safety around the slide.

Division of Geological and Geophysical Surveys (DGGS) lidar-helicopter survey began yesterday. The helicopter began surveying the Mile 11-12 slide area but was unable to complete the survey due to weather. An additional flight will be completed today pending good weather.

On Sunday, the Red Cross deployed a 3-person Incident Care Condolence Team to Wrangell. Sheltering operations ended with the reopening of limited residential traffic on Zimovia Highway allowing return of displaced residents.

The Alaska Division of Forestry and Fire Protection (DOF&FP) deployed a Public Information Officer to support the City & Borough of Wrangell with public messaging.

Recovery Branch:

The State Individual Assistance registration hotline and website opened yesterday, November 28th, and applications are being accepted from the state-declared areas.

State Public Assistance is providing the City and Borough of Wrangell and the City of Coffman Cove with technical advice on the disaster reimbursement process.

Diomede Division:

On Sunday, the community reported that the city office building, constructed in 1978, had several wooden supports fail on one side of the structure. On Monday, remaining supports collapsed leaving the building on the ground, with the northwest corner resting on the community elementary school. Foundation damage resulted in the building being condemned, and demolition planned. SEOC is deploying a DOT&PF structural engineer Friday to Diomede, who will accompany the Bering Straits School District Facilities Director and a representative from Kawerak. DOT&PF engineer will assess the collapsed structure for hasty recovery of city/tribal property and evaluate the school for student attendance. Diomede's school is closed until the school structure is assessed. The community post office, previously located in the collapsed building, relocated to the old washeteria building to continue mail service and food deliveries via bypass mail.

SEOC is actively working with Diomede City and Tribal officials, the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, Department of Environmental Conservation, City of Nome emergency management, Kawarek Inc., and Bering Strait School District.

Other Southeast Communities Division:

City of Craig: On Tuesday, November 28, the SEOC was notified of damage caused by flooding and landslides across Prince of Wales Island. The City of Craig reported their public works department did emergency route clearance work across the island. While no injuries are reported, several homes are reporting damage. A local disaster declaration is on the Craig City Council agenda tomorrow.

SEOC will deploy a Prine of Wales Division Supervisor to the Island tomorrow to coordinate an initial assessment of damages and provide on-site response coordination.


Roadways

Wrangell: Two lanes of the Zimovia Highway have been opened, but the roadway remains restricted to emergency traffic only. DOT&PF have noted cracking of the slide approx. 30' upslope from the roadway and are monitoring with UAS.

Wrangell Police are implementing a limited access schedule for residential use of the roadway.

City of Craig: City of Craig reported public works did emergency route clearance work across the island. No injuries reported, several homes damaged. A local disaster declaration is on the Craig City Council agenda tomorrow. DOT&PF is engaged with the city.


Weather Forecast
