Significant Issues:

Strong winds blowing to the northwest in the region northwest of Aniakchak and east of Port Heiden have picked up loose volcanic ash and carried up to 3,000 ft. to the northwest today. Aniakchak volcano remains at color code **GREEN**. Resuspended volcanic ash should be considered hazardous and could be damaging to aircraft and health.
