

Significant Weather:



The following Blizzard Warnings are in effect:

- Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley Blizzard conditions occurring. Additional snow accumulations up to 3 inches and ice accumulations of a light glaze expected. Winds gusting as high as 55 mph through 3:00PM this afternoon.
- Chukchi Sea Coast Blizzard conditions occurring. Additional snow accumulations up to 3 inches and ice accumulations of a light glaze expected. Winds gusting as high as 45 mph through 3:00PM this afternoon.

Winter Storm Warnings are in effect for the following areas:


- Seward Peninsula Coast from Friday evening through Monday morning for snow accumulation of 8 to 18 inches with winds gusting to 55mph through 9:00AM Tuesday.
- St Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast Heavy mixed precipitation expected. Additional snow accumulations of 8 to 12 inches and ice accumulations up to 0.05 inches expected. Winds gusting as high as 40 mph through 9:00AM Tuesday.
- Yukon Delta Heavy mixed precipitation expected. Additional snow accumulations of up to 4 inches and ice accumulations of up to two tenths of an inch expected. Winds gusting as high as 55 mph through 3:00PM this afternoon.
- Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula Heavy mixed precipitation expected. Additional snow accumulations of 6 to 14 inches and ice accumulations of a light glaze expected. Winds gusting as high as 50 mph through 3:00PM this afternoon.

The following Winter Weather Advisories are in effect:

 Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys - Snow and blowing snow occurring. Visibility one half mile or less at times. Additional snow accumulations up to 4 inches expected. Winds gusting as high as 35 mph through 3:00PM this afternoon.

Avalanche Forecast:



- Haines Considerable avalanche conditions above 1,500ft and moderate below 1,500 ft.
- Valdez Considerable avalanche danger above 1,500ft. and moderate below 1,500ft.
- Cordova area: Moderate advisory level above 2,000ft and low advisory level below 2,000ft.
- Turnagain Pass Considerable advisory level above 1,000ft, moderate advisory level below 1,000 ft.
