

Significant Weather:



Wind chill advisories are in effect for the Northeastern Brooks Range and the Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast until noon Wednesday for wind chills as low as 55 below zero.

Winter Storm Watches are in effect for the following areas:

- City and Borough of Yakutat, Glacier Bay, Eastern Chichagof Island, Cape Fairweather, City and Borough of Juneau in effect late Tuesday evening through Wednesday night for 4 to 8 inches of snow.
- Municipality of Skagway, Haines, and Kulkwan from Wednesday morning through Thursday morning for 8 to 16 inches of snow.

Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for the following areas:


- Eastern Aleutian Islands, Alaska Peninsula until 4am Thursday for snow of 3 to 6 inches and winds gusting to 55mph.
- Yukon Delta until midnight tonight for winds gusting to 40mph.
- St. Lawrence Island, and the Bering Strait Coast until midnight tonight for winds gusting to 50mph.

Special weather statement has been issued for the Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, Eastern Norton Sound, and Nulato Hills. Winds of 15 to 35mph will causing blowing snow conditions starting tonight through Wednesday.

Special weather statement issued for the Southeastern Brooks Range, Upper Koyukuk Valley, Yukon Flats, Central Interior, Middle Tanana Valley and Denali. Breezy winds of 10 to 20mph with gusts up to 35mph and wind chills of 15 to 30 below zero beginning Wednesday

Avalanche Forecast:



- Haines moderate avalanche conditions above 1,500ft and low below 1,500 ft.
- Valdez Low avalanche danger at all elevations.
- Cordova area: Moderate advisory level above1,000 ft and low advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass Low advisory level at all elevations.
- Hatcher Pass Moderate advisory level at all elevations and on slopes 35° and steeper.
