

- Red Flag Warning for Upper Tanana Valley, Fourty Mile, Deltana and Tanana Flats in effect until 10 PM ADKT this evening.
- Wind Advisory is in effect for Denali and the Eastern Alaska Range until 1 AM ADKT Saturday.
- Special Weather Statement issued for the Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys; Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley; Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula; Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys; Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys – Rising Rivers Through the Weekend.
- Flood watch in effect for Haines Borough and Klukwan due to rises on the Chilkat River Friday evening through Saturday afternoon.
