Significant Issues:

Juneau

SEOC is carefully monitoring the conditions in Southeast Alaska. The National Weather Service (NWS) Regional Operations Center (ROC) contacted the SEOC regarding heavy snow fall followed by heavy rain expected in Juneau through the weekend. There is concern for additional building collapse due to weight, sinking boats, flooding, as well as increased avalanche risk. SEOC contacted DOT&PF, USCG, City & Borough of Juneau (CBJ) Emergency Manager (EM) and Tligit & Haida Central Council (THCC).




Avalanche Hazards:
