Significant Issues:

Scammon Bay Fuel Shortage

SEOC was notified yesterday regarding a fuel shortage in the community. The community states they are out of diesel fuel and have approx. one week of gasoline left. SEOC contacted DCRA Bulk Fuel Loan Program and the Local Government Specialist to inform them of the situation and for DCRA to reach out to the community for potential assistance in purchasing/delivery of fuel. SEOC will contact other regional partners to identify potential loans of fuel or economic assistance to the community.

Savoonga Low walrus Harvest and Food Shortage

SEOC will hold an interagency meeting today with Kawerak, AK VOAD partners, and ANTHC to identify food resources for the community. SEOC also contacted the Division of Public Assistance SNAP program and USDA for possible assistance as well.



Avalanche Hazard




Travel in avalanche terrain is not recommended. Avoid being on or beneath all steep slopes.
