Significant Issues:

Upper Yukon Division:

Yesterday, the Upper Yukon Division conducted flights along the Yukon River to Stevens Village, observing intact ice 15 miles downriver of Beaver. Weather conditions grounded the division in Stevens Village, with icing and wet snow accumulation of 1 inch. The division returned to Fairbanks after waiting out the weather. A Flood Watch remains in effect for Circle. Today, weather permitting, the division plans to monitor the breakup front to Fort Yukon and conduct a media interview on KZPA Fort Yukon Radio.

Kuskokwim Division:

Overnight, active flooding was reported in Tuluksak, prompting one family to evacuate to high ground and sheltering within the community at the school. The community water intake pond is inundated, preventing water production. A Flood Warning was issued for Tuluksak, effective until May 9. Today, the division intends to assess damages in Tuluksak, accompanied by Bethel Search and Rescue, and continue Riverwatch observations.

Ice jams are reported at various locations along the Kuskokwim River. Efforts are underway to replace the damaged water pump in Kwethluk, with support from SEOC Mass Care Group, and Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium RMW.

Cooper River Division:

The Cooper River Division maintained contact with area Incident Command and the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. Water levels remain high, impacting local roads and building basements, but the Glenn Highway remains open. A Flood Advisory for Glennallen and a Flood Watch for the entire Copper River Basin remain in effect.

Middle Yukon Division:

Tomorrow, the Middle Yukon Division plans to deploy to Galena to begin overflights of the middle portion of the Yukon River and meet with communities in the area.

Overall Assessment:

Riverwatch divisions continue to monitor river conditions and coordinate response efforts in affected communities. Flooding in Tuluksak has prompted evacuation measures, while efforts are underway to address water pump damage in Kwethluk. High water levels persist in the Cooper River area, with impacts on local infrastructure. Continued vigilance and coordinated response efforts are crucial to mitigating the impacts of flooding and ensuring the safety and well-being of affected communities.

This report is based on information gathered and provided by the respective river watch divisions and is intended to inform stakeholders and the public about current river conditions and emergency management efforts.





Flood Watch: Kuskokwim Delta, Copper River Basin – Ice jam and snowmelt in effect until Friday morning.

Yukon Flats: Ice jam flood Watch in effect until Tuesday afternoon.

Flood Advisory: Copper River Basin, Kuskokwim Delta – Flood warning in effect until 1215 Thursday for Tuluksak and surrounding areas on the Kuskokwim River.

Special Weather Statement: Yukon Flats; White Mountains and High Terrain South of the Yukon River; Forty-mile Country; Upper Tanana Valley; Delta Junction; Upper Chena River Valley; Tanana Flats; Eielson AFB and Salcha; Goldstream Valley and Nenana Hills; Chatanika River Valley; Two Rivers; Fairbanks Metro Area; Eastern Alaska Range North of Trims Camp; Eastern Alaska Range South of Trims Camp - Rain and snow mix on Tuesday.
