Riverwatch:

SITREP - May 10, 2024

Governor Dunleavy declared a disaster last night for the Kuskokwim River communities in the Lower Kuskokwim and Yupiit Regional Education Attendance Areas in response to serious community flooding.

Riverwatch:

Upper Yukon Division:

Yesterday Division flew to Circle, Beaver, Fort Yukon, Circle and then back to Fairbanks. Division met with community members, Athabascan Tribal Government, and did a live onair interview on Fort Yukon Radio.

While ice still holds on the Yukon near Circle, it is slowly degrading in-place and, while there is still significant snow in the hills, a significant push of water is not expected. Division is flying today to Stevens Village, Fort Yukon, Circle, then back to Fairbanks. With improved conditions, Division will demobilize today. Any further operations required in the Upper Yukon will be handled by the Middle Yukon Division operating out of Galena. A Flood Watch remains in effect for Circle.

Middle Yukon Division:

Division conducted aerial surveillance this morning from Galena to Koyukuk. Division landed in Koyukuk and met with community to brief on conditions. Division then returned to Galena and conducted interview on KIYU Radoi - Galena Division plans to fly again this afternoon to Tanana and fly the Yukon downriver, checking conditions.

Kuskokwim Division:

Tuluksak - Water receding

Akiak - Water receding

Kwethluk - Division flew to Kwethluk this afternoon. Community flooding ongoing.

Residences:

- Some homes inundated
- Shelter open at school
- Buildings surrounded by water.

Infrastructure:

- Sewage system shut down due to flooding.
- Many buildings surrounded by water.
- Airstrip access road inundated

Division delivered an AVCP VPSO to the community late yesterday to assist with response coordination. Red Cross notified for residence support.

Division was in the community at the time of this report.

Flood Warning remains in effect.

Bethel – Division met with the Bethel City Manager yesterday to review the City Emergency Operations Plan and shelter operations. One resident relocated from a home that was in a low-lying area and inundated in the Alligator Acres subdivision State Office of Fish and Game was closed again today due to flooding.

Division upgraded Bethel to a Flood Warning

Oscarville - Community reporting flood water has stabilized.

Low-lying areas inundated. No major community impacts.

Napaskiak – Division landed in community this morning. Community flooding ongoing. Residences:

- One family sheltered at school overnight.
- Several residents with low-lying homes sheltered with relatives/friends within the community last night.
- Several residents have chosen to temporarily relocate to Bethel by self-purchased air.
- All buildings surrounded by water.

Infrastructure:

- Water treatment plant and sewage system at risk if water rises further.
- All buildings surrounded by water.
- Airstrip access road inundated Environmental:
- Oil sheen noted near community on Kuskokwim River, community fuel farm suspected. ADEC advised.

Division deployed an AVCP VPSO to the community by air last night and will follow on with a second today to assist with flood response operations.

Napakiak – Flooding reported. Division intends to fly in an AVCP VPSO today to assist with coordinating flood response.

Ice re-jammed above Napaskiak so additional flooding is expected. Division will continue to fly river today to monitor conditions and coordinate flood response operations. SEOC is deploying a 2nd Operations Specialist tomorrow to assist with flood response coordination

out of Bethel.

Winter weather with snow in the area is slowing Kuskokwim breakup but a warming trend is expected in the next 48 hrs.

Cooper River Division:

No change in conditions

Mass Care Group:

Space Weather:

A G4 magnetic storm, caused by corona mass ejections on the sun, began today. Potential impacts are to GPS, high frequency radio, power, and other communications. See below:


WHAT: SWPC's First G4 Watch Since Jan. 2005


<u>KEY MESSAGES</u>: A Severe (G4) Geomagnetic Storm is <u>LIKELY</u> – possibly as early as later today and continuing through the weekend; exact timing remains somewhat uncertain. At least <u>seven</u> earth-directed Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs) are in transit.

IMPACTS: HF communication, GPS, power grids (voltage control), spacecraft, satellite navigation, and other technologies may be affected. *Critical infrastructure operators have been notified.*

CONTEXT: Only three Severe (G4) geomagnetic storms have occurred so far this solar cycle (since 2019); the last was a brief occurrence on March 23. This is SWPC's first G4 Watch since 2005. The last Extreme (G5) event occurred with the Halloween Storms in 2003.

CAUSE: The source has been a large, complex sunspot cluster (NOAA Region 3664) that is 17 times the diameter of Earth. Additional activity from this Region is still expected.




