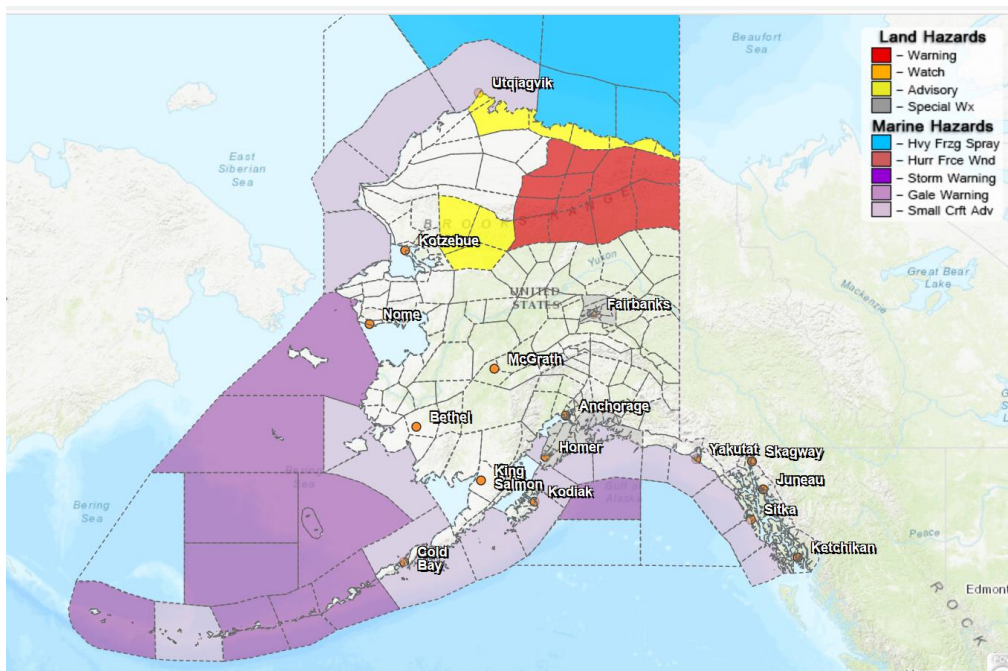

Seward Flooding: Over the weekend, the Kenai Peninsula Borough, (KPB) emergency manager contacted the SEOC to report of ongoing flooding in Seward due to heavy rainfall. The Lowell Point Bridge was threatened by runoff from the Lowell Creek requiring emergency protective measures and flood-fighting operations. Flood protection barriers were also placed in one subdivision. There is also flooding along Mile 3 and Mile 5 of the Seward Highway near the Bear Creek Fire Station. Japanese Creek was diverted towards the mountain and is flowing through the road wash out through the alders near the waste transfer site. Per a KPB request, the SEOC Operations Section has sent an individual to assist the KPB EOC. The City of Seward has declared a local disaster and sought assistance from KPB. As well, the SEOC has received the Kenai Peninsula Borough declaration of disaster emergency, a notification letter from the City Manager of Seward to the Mayor outlining the specifics of their emergency declaration made October 13. The KPB emergency manager reports the borough activated their incident management team (IMT) yesterday in response to the flooding in and around Seward.

Significant Weather



Poor weather statewide continues. There is a Winter Storm Warning from the Southeastern Brooks Range, Northern Brooks Range and Arctic Coastal Plain to the Koyukuk River through 6 A.M. Thursday morning. Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys are under Winter Weather Advisory now in effect until 6 am akdt Thursday.

Additionally, there is a Special Weather Statement for Western Kenai Peninsula, the Western, Southeast, and Northeast Prince William sound, including the Cities of Kenai, Soldotna, Homer, Cooper landing, Whittier, Seward, Girdwood, Moose pass, Valdez, Thompson Pass, and Cordova. The Statement is for strong winds and heavy rain expected again Thursday and Friday along the north gulf coast and southern cook inlet.
