# Incident Objectives



## Objectives

Ensure the safety and security of responders as well as maximize the protection of public health and welfare.

Prevent the spread of COVID-19 in Alaska by implementing statewide containment and community mitigation strategies.

Support local emergency response operations through the coordination of information, situational reporting and resource requests.

Maintain statewide medical surge capacity to include Alternate Care Site facilities and staffing.

Execute State COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution and Management Plan.



# Incident Objectives (cont.)



Objectives
Support communities in the execution of local COVID-19 distribution and management plans to include public information, local distribution resources, and ensuring vaccine access to all members of the community.
Maintain COVID-19 specimen collection centers and point of care testing sites statewide.
Implement the Governor's health orders.
Keep the public, stakeholders and the media informed of operational activities and address rumors or incorrect information in a timely manner.
Continue supporting non-COVID-19 response operations, as necessary.

# Community Lifeline Status

	<h2>Food, Water, Shelter</h2>	
	 <p><b>Shelter</b></p>	<p><b><u>Haines Mass Care</u></b>  A robust mass care effort continues to look after approximately 101 sheltered residents in local hotels, plus possibly another 100+ residents housed within the community with neighbors, friends, etc. Mass care operations are a prime focus of the state and local response. Red Cross and The Salvation Army are providing food, water, shelter support, and other needs to evacuees.</p> <p><b><u>Haines Home Damage</u></b>  At least 21 homes are inaccessible, 2 homes completely destroyed by the slide and 3 with major damage. Red Cross tentatively planning to conduct damage assessments beginning 10 Dec 2020.</p>

	 <p><b>Highway/ Roadway</b></p>	<p><b><u>Tenakee Springs Roads and Bridges</u></b>  City of Tenakee Springs describes landslides destroying the Indian River bridge, and damaging School House Creek Bridge and water supply infrastructure</p> <p><b><u>Haines Roads and Bridges</u></b>  All state and major connector roads in the Haines area are currently open and emergency repairs have been completed. The Haines Highway is open from Haines to the Canadian border. Lutak Road is open. Beach Road and Mount Riley Road are closed in the evacuation area near the large landslide.</p>



# Significant Weather Impacts for Transportation

## Anchorage & Mat-Su

- No significant weather. Light snow showers.
- IFR/MVFR flying thru the passes

## West Coast

- Areas of snow and blowing snow. High Wind Warning thru Norton Sound Monday
- IFR/MVFR isolated areas of turbulence and icing

## Interior

- Winter Wx Adv or Warning for blowing and drifting snow for much of the region thru Tues morning.
- Areas of MVFR flight conditions

## Northern

- Blowing snow. Winter Wx Adv for NW coast thru Tuesday morning
- IFR conditions areas of turbulence thru Brooks Range

## Gulf Coast Region

- Lingering snow, rain at lower elev. along N Gulf Monday.
- MVFR flight conditions

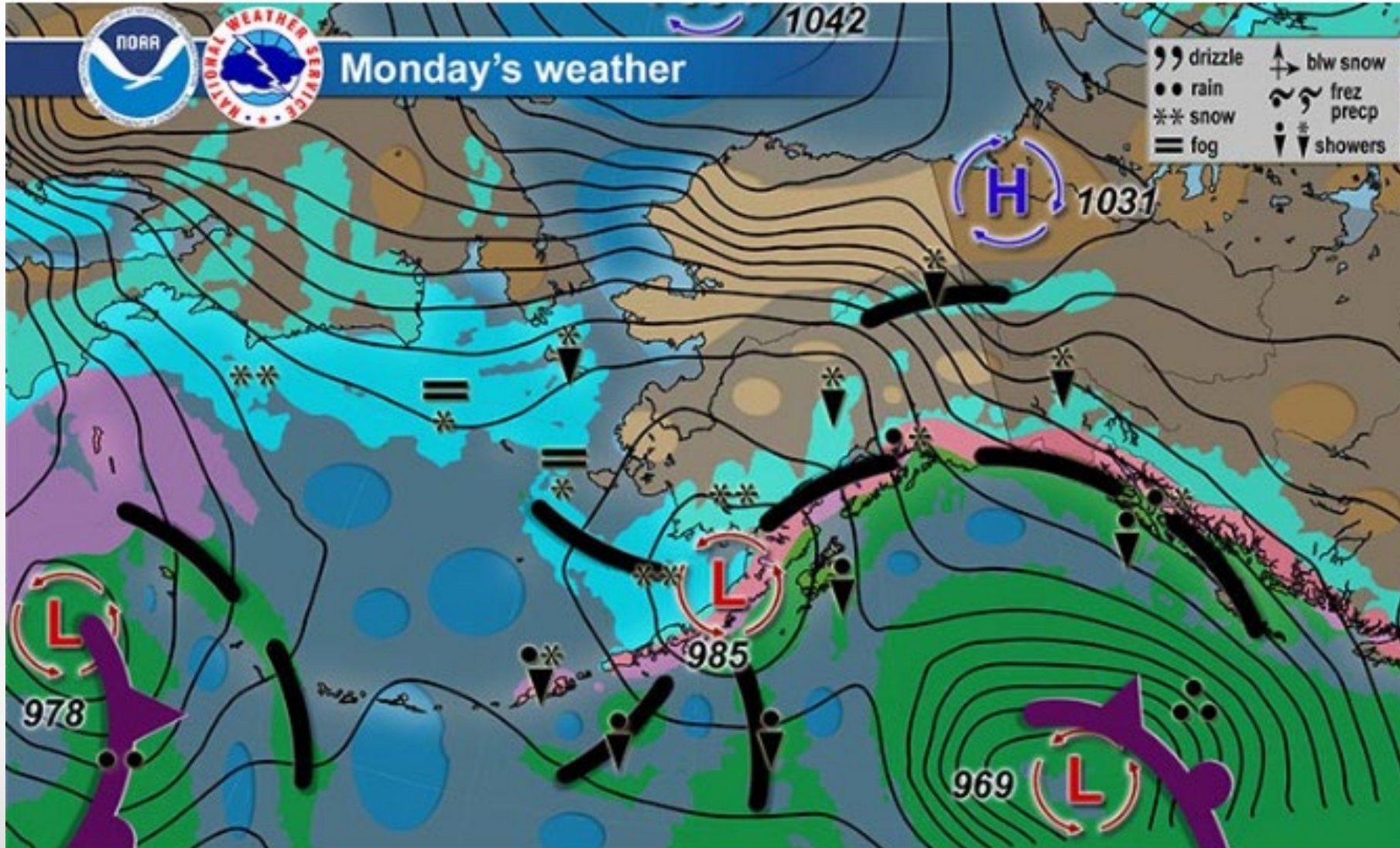
## Southeast

- Winter Wx Adv Northern end for wintry mix until noon Mon. Rain over the southern end.
- MVFR/IFR flying improving Tuesday



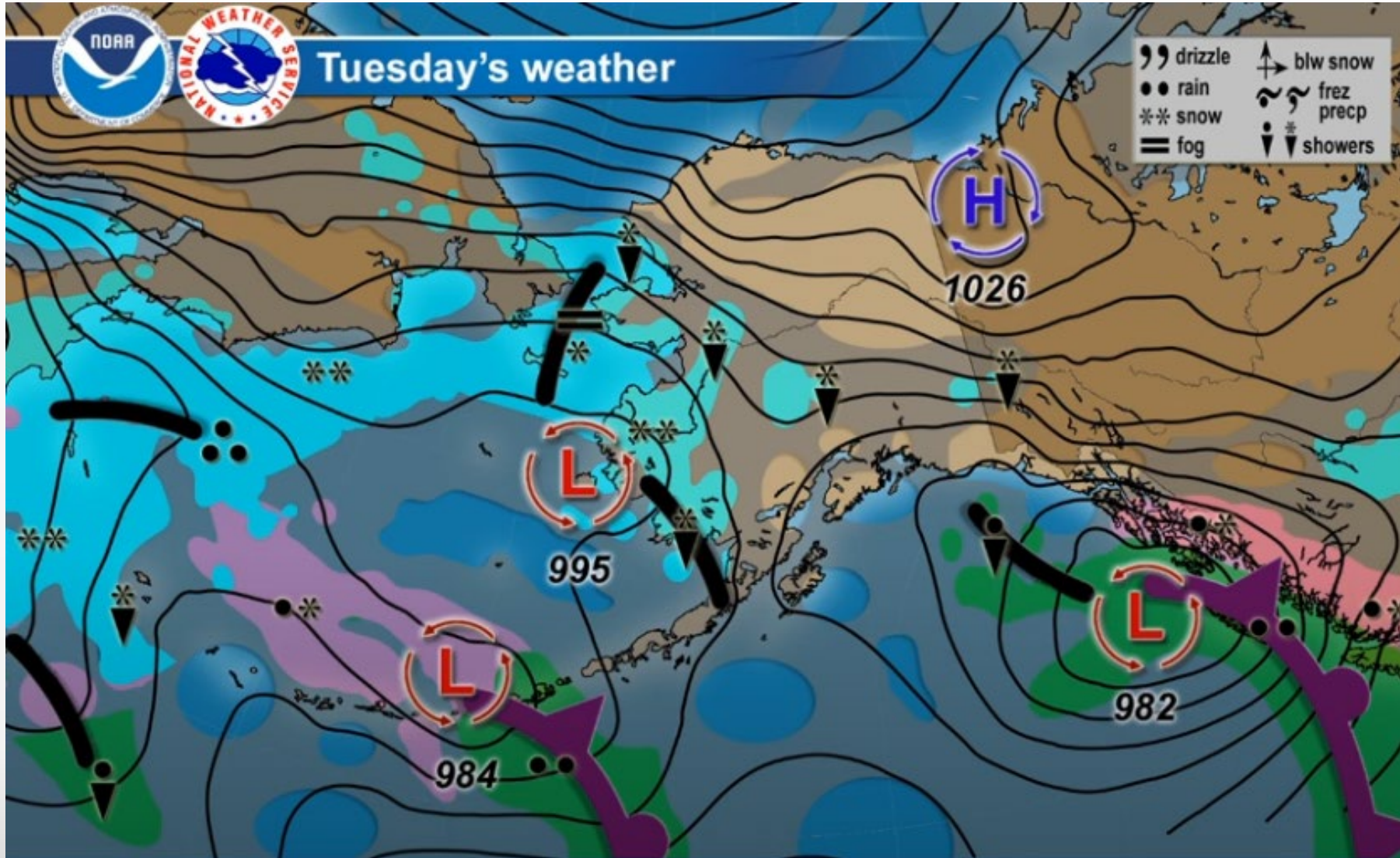

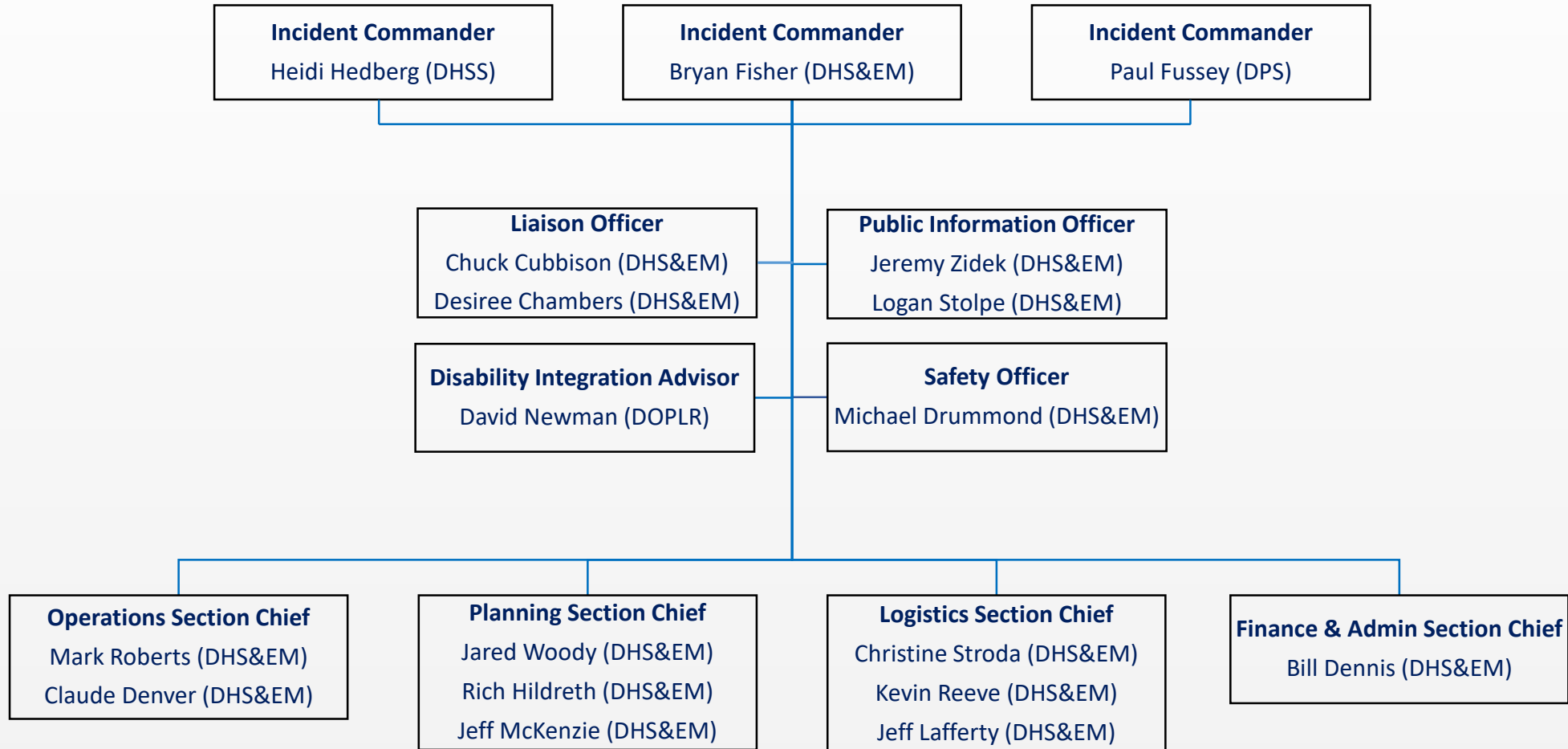

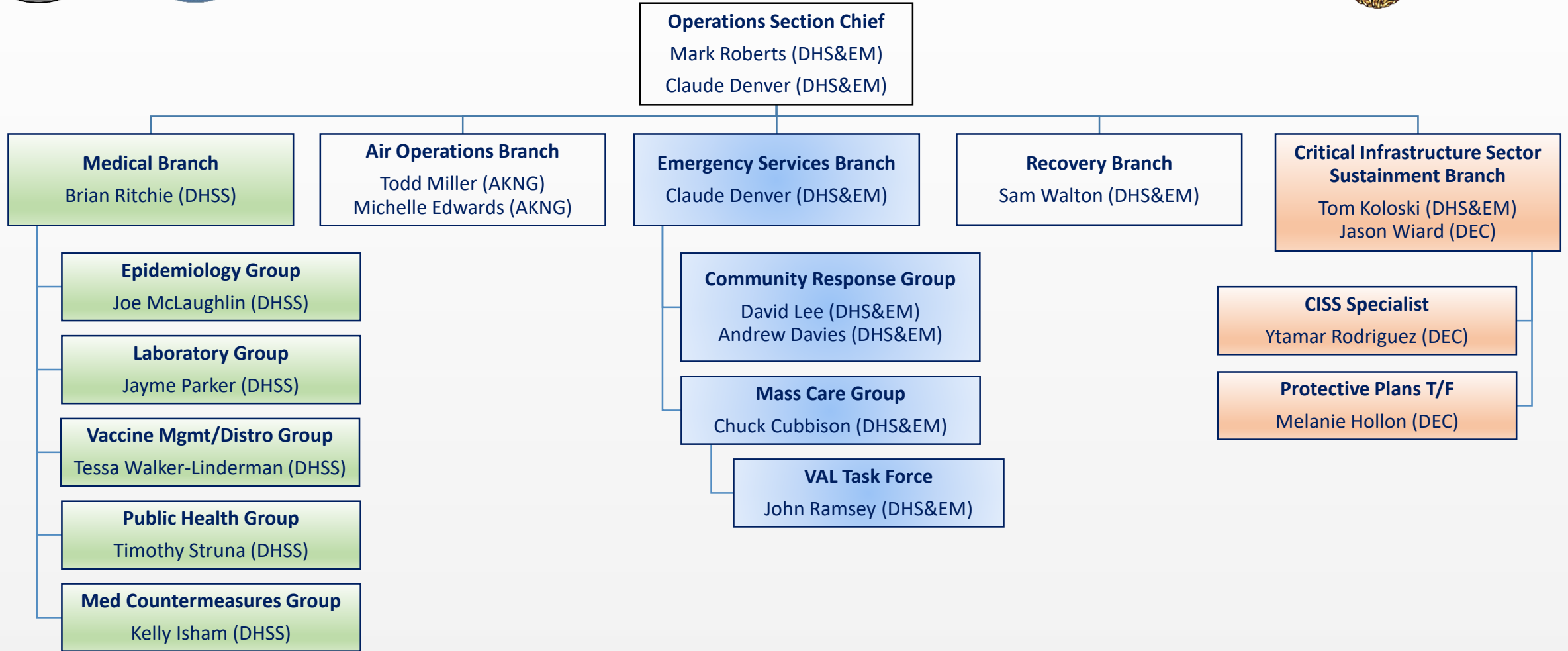
